COUNCIL MEMBER COMRIE: I just wanted to commend the community on behalf of trying to make sure that they had the best opportunity to have input in the plan and thank the SCA for stepping up and making sure that there is community input in all aspects of the plan. you know, my focus during the hearing was to make sure that the demolition was done as safely as possible. I understand that there will be a plan in place to make that happen and that those children will be moved for September because with cheese in the building, it's not a safe environment for children. I'm glad that those items are going to get done. I hope that there will be in actually real communication with the community to ensure that the demolition is done safely. Thank you.

CHAIRPERSON LAPPIN: I think you're referring to P.S. 133 in Brooklyn. I agree with you. I know this was a difficult and obviously is a very significant structure for the community. When you have to decide between new school space and a beloved community garden and a building that

concerned that they didn't identify some of the 2 3 contaminants. They just said there is water in 4 earth and contaminants under there in the plans to do something about that. I'm concerned about the 5 traffic congestion. I'm concerned about what 6 7 happens to the area around the garden. I think 8 that they're really bullying the school to support this and saying that this existing school will be 9 10 renovated and good things will happen if they 11 support it so they can put the other part in there 12 that increases it by 600 students. I think they should renovate that school whether they support 13 this school or not. So this is something I think 14 15 needs to go back to the drawing board and they should do better on this and deal with the 16 17 environmental concerns and deal with this school whether or not they bring in another school. 18 19 said there are other areas for that school. 20 that one I vote no and I vote aye on the other 21 school.
