Additionally, the Committee will be considering two pieces of legislation that would determine the maturity, sale and use of bond anticipation notes. These notes are often used in financing infrastructure projects within the City.

The Committee will also look at voting on an omnibus extender, which would extend various financial emergency act provisions.

The Council will also consider a bill that would amend the Administrative Code to phase in a single sales factor allocation over a ten-year period. When a business operates both within and outside the City, it is necessary to determine what portion of that firm's net income was earned within the City and thus, taxable by the City.

Currently, this is done by calculating three factors; the percentage of a firm's sales, employment and capital that are in the City. The average of these three factors represents the percentage of the firm's income earned in the City and its taxes are based on this
