AN ACT authorizing the city of New York to reconvey its interest in certain real property acquired July 1, 2008 by in rem tax foreclosure in the borough of Staten Island, to Greentree Homeowners Association, notwithstanding expiration of the two year period within which application may be made to the city to release its interest in property thus acquired; Block No. 1560, Lot No. 33, on the tax map for the borough of Staten Island

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Findings. On July 1, 2008, the city of New York acquired 2 title to premises designated as lot #33, in tax block 1560, also known 3 as Greentree Lane in the borough of Staten Island, based on non-payment of taxes due to inadvertence by the Greentree Homeowners Association, the former owner of such property. Pursuant to sections 11-424 and 11-424.1 of the administrative code of the city of New York, the city may release its interest in property thus acquired if an application for 8 such a release is filed with the city's department of citywide adminis-9 trative services within two years of the date on which the city's deed 10 is recorded and if such application is approved by the in rem foreclo-11 sure release board. Pursuant to paragraph 1 of subdivision b of section 12 11-424 of the administrative code of the city of New York an applicant 13 whose interest in said property arises by reason of death of the prior 14 owner shall provide such information necessary to prove applicant's 15 right to make such application. In addition, since the New York city 16 charter requires that the sale of city owned property be at public 17 auction or by sealed bids (except as otherwise provided by law), state 18 legislative authorization is necessary to permit said reconveyance.

PURPOSE:

To authorize the City of New York to reconvey a parcel of land to the Greentree Homeowners Association, Inc.

SUMMARY OF PROVISIONS:

Section one. Through a Staten Island in rem tax foreclosure, the City of New York acquired title to premises designated as Block No. 1560, Lot No. 33 in Staten Island, New York, in the borough of Staten Island based on non-payment of taxes due to inadvertent failure to pay taxes by the Greentree Homeowners Association, Inc.

JUSTIFICATION:

Upon approval of the application by the in rem foreclosure release board, the Greentree Homeowners Association, Inc., agrees to pay all taxes, interest, penalties and other charges to gain their property back. The property in question is a road (Greentree Lane) that is the only access point into and out of the Associations group of homes. Problems could develop for the owners if the City of New York were to sell the property at auction. This bill would give the property back to the Association after all taxes, interest, penalties and other charges are paid and will put it back on New York City's tax rolls.
