Today we have two items left on the agenda. Land Use items number 51, 52 and 53 which are related. Brooklyn Community Board 1, Item C08039, it's an amendment to a zoning map. It's in Council Member Levin's district. There was a lot of work done on this project by many people. We've been joined by Council Member Jumaane Williams.

I think that this has been the most interesting project that has come before me during my short tenure in this committee as chair. I want to congratulate Council Member Levin and all of the parties involved to get to today's decision.

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Clearly, when you're working on projects and you have people with different mindsets about how to get a final solution, it takes a lot of conversation. This project took a lot of conversation but it still got done within the timeframe. I want to congratulate the Land Use staff for all of their work on this. to congratulate Council Member Levin for doing everything he needed to do to continue to represent his community in the manner that he was elected. Also, we have Land Use number 57, a citywide project; it's a residential streetscapes preservation project. It's an amendment to the citywide zoning text. As it is citywide, it's item N 100139 ZRY. This is creating conditions to improve and codify opportunities to clean up a lot of problems that were dealing with front yard

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parking, with creating parking locations and curb cut regulations for residential usage, tightening up the responsibilities and regulations dealing with homeowners.

I want to congratulate again City
Planning, the Land Use staff. I want to also
congratulate Council Member Mark Weprin on all of
the things that he did with these two projects.
You were hiding back there when I was looking for
you a second ago. Domenic was hiding up. We want
to thank all of the people that were involved in
putting these together.

There is a longstanding ancillary issue that has come up that we need to address.

We do have a commitment from the Mayor's Office to sit down and have some substantive discussions about R-3 and R-4 housing and what we can do to deal with some issues around that housing that are happening in practicality but need to be dealt with substantively.

concerns and reservations what this means in terms
of making what are now illegal occupancies safe
and legal for our firefighters and for the
families that live there. But I appreciate the
chair's statement that the administration is
committed to a dialogue to really start the
conversation to move towards a saner policy on
this issue. With that understanding, I vote aye
on all.
CAROL SHINE: Council Member Levin?
COUNCIL MEMBER LEVIN: Can I

explain my vote? I am going to be voting aye on all items. With regard to the streetscapes bill, I echo the concerns raised by Council Member Lander and other colleagues of mine. It's my hope that the administration will continue a dialogue and work with this Council and work with the members of this committee and the members of the Housing and Buildings Committee and Chairman Dilan on resolving issues with regards to legalizing spaces now that are currently not legalized so

discussion on it. Thank you.
