**INTRO. No: 206** 

**COMMITTEE:** Health

**TITLE:** A Local Law to amend the administrative code of the city of New York, in relation to certain provisions of title 17 and to repeal subchapters 1 and 5 of chapter 3, relating to permits for the sale or transfer of milk and milk products and to medical records respectively.

**SPONSORS:** Council Members Arroyo, Comrie, Fidler, and White.

**SUMMARY OF LEGISLATION:** This legislation renumbers section 17-123 titled "Aliens," renumbers section 17-185, adds a heading to section 17-190 and repeals Subchapters 1 and 5 of Chapter 3 of Title 17 concerning information to be supplied with a permit for the sale or transfer of milk and milk products and permits for medical record storage facilities, respectively.

**EFFECTIVE DATE:** This local law would take effect ninety days after its enactment into law.
