WHEREAS, the Landmarks Preservation Commission filed with the Council on April 5, 2012 a copy of its designation dated March 27, 2012 (the "Designation"), of the Dennison and Lydia Wood House located at 310 Spring Street, Community District 2, Borough of Manhattan, as a landmark and Tax Map Block 594, Lot 34, as its landmark site pursuant to Section 3020 of the New York City Charter;

WHEREAS, the Designation is subject to review by the Council pursuant to Section 3020 of the City Charter;

WHEREAS, the City Planning Commission submitted to the Council on May 25, 2012 its report on the Designation dated May 23, 2012 (the "Report");

WHEREAS, upon due notice, the Council held a public hearing on the Designation on June 19, 2012; and

WHEREAS, the Council has considered the land use implications and other policy issues relating to the Designation;
