State Legislation Resolution requesting the New York State Legislature to pass bills introduced by Senator Maltese, S.6108, and Assembly Member Abbate, A.7174-A, "AN ACT to make certain widows and children of certain former uniformed employees of New York city police departments eligible for special accidental death benefits pursuant to section 208-f of the general municipal law".

Whereas, bills have been introduced in the New York State Legislature by Senator Maltese, S.6108, and Assembly Member Abbate, A.7174-A, "AN ACT to make certain widows and children of certain former uniformed employees of New York city police departments eligible for special accidental death benefits pursuant to section 208-f of the general municipal law"; and

Whereas, the enactment of the above State Legislation requires the concurrence of the Council of the City of New York as the local legislative body; now, therefore, be it

Resolved, that the Council of the City of New York, in accordance with the provisions of Section 2 of Article 9 of the Constitution of the State of New York, does hereby request the New York State Legislature to enact into law the aforesaid pending bills.
