A Local Law to amend the administrative code of the city of New York, in relation to requiring the New York City Police Department to allow individuals to request certain records through its website.

### Be it enacted by the Council as follows:

Section 1. Chapter one of title 14 of the administrative code of the city of New York is amended to add

a new section 14-152, to read as follows:

§14-152. Records available on the world wide web. The department's website shall provide a manner

in which individuals may submit an on-line request for certain records, including but not limited to (a) reports

verifying a crime or listing lost property and (b) police accident reports.

§ 2. This local law shall take effect 180 days after its enactment into law, provided that the

commissioner may take any actions necessary prior to such effective date for the implementation of this local
