A Local Law to amend the administrative code of the City of New York, in relation to requiring the New York City Police Department to report on arrests of juveniles.

## Be it enacted by the Council as follows:

Section 1. Subdivision a of section 14-150 of the administrative code of the city of New York is

amended by adding a new paragraph 9 to read as follows:

9. A report of the total number of individuals aged eighteen and under arrested for violations, and for

each arrest (i) the charge, whether penal law or other section of law; (ii) the age of the individual arrested; (iii)

the race of the individual arrested; (iv) the precinct of the arrest; and (v) whether or not the location of the arrest

corresponds to the address of a school run by the Department of Education.

§2. This local law shall take effect ninety days after its enactment into law.
