Today, we'll vote on Proposed Intro 129-A sponsored by Council Member Brannan. We first considered this bill on March 1st of this year.

Intro. 129-A would establish a pilot program to install solar canopies on at least one City-controlled parking lot in each borough where such a canopy would be cost-effective. In addition, for each

3 canopy is installed, the Department of Citywide

4 Administrative Services would be required to install

at least five EV chargers that are capable of

providing a full charge in three to eight hours. 6

7 Following the pilot program, this Local Law would

8 require a report on the total number and locations of

the City-controlled parking lots where solar canopies

were installed and where they would be cost-effective 10

11 and recommendations for making the program permanent.

12 The program will take advantage of real estate the

13 City already controls. Utilizing City-controlled

14 parking lots for solar installations will assist the

15 City with increasing local renewable energy

16 generation, support grid reliability by increasing

17 distributed generation resources and expand access to

18 local electric vehicle charging infrastructure. It

19 will be a visible demonstration of the City's

20 commitment to finding creating solutions to confront

the climate crisis. 21
