Summary of Legislation: This bill requires the New York City Police Department (NYPD) to publish information on its website about reporting identity theft and filing criminal complaints of identity theft. The information must include a description of the types of conduct that constitute an identity theft, guidance on protecting personal information, and information about how to file a complaint. This bill also requires NYPD to train officers about how to respond to and investigate identity theft.
