CHAIRPERSON GUTIÉRREZ: Thank you. Oh, I have to do this. [GAVEL] Good morning. I'm Council Member Jennifer Gutiérrez. I'm Chair to the Committee on Technology.

I'd like to welcome everyone to today's

Committee on Technology vote on Proposed Intro. 1122
A, sponsored by myself, in relation to a plan for

expanding home access to broadband internet. The

Committee previously heard testimony on this bill as

part of our April 29, 2025 hearing.

New York City is the largest and greatest city in America, in the world, yet here in the 21st

2 century, some New Yorkers still lack affordable, 3 reliable broadband at home. In 2020, the Internet 4 Master Plan was introduced by the de Blasio Administration to connect all New Yorkers and open opportunities for smaller internet service providers. 6 The new Administration abandoned this plan with no 8 explanation and instead entered a bulk purchasing agreement with two major ISPs to provide internet to some NYCHA developments. My bill ensures that the 10 11 City has a real plan to connect every New Yorker not 12 limited to NYCHA gives every internet service 13 provider a fair chance and makes clear that these 14 connections are not to be used for secondary 15 purposes, such as surveillance by City agencies. Internet access is not a luxury nowadays. It is 16 17 essential infrastructure for education, work, healthcare, and even social life. New York should 18 19 lead by providing affordable and equitable access, 20 fair competition, and respect for residents' privacy. 21 Today, we are correcting a mistake, ensuring that our 2.2 city can lead instead of lag, and make sure every 2.3 single New Yorker has access to affordable broadband and we build a diverse and healthy landscape. 24

Broadband is why I was really excited to Chair this
