Proposed Intro No. / Title: Intro 652 / in relation to requiring the commissioner of health and mental hygiene to establish and operate a pilot program providing free mental health services to children who have been returned to their home following a removal, and providing for the repeal of such provisions upon the expiration thereof

Summary of Legislation: Establishes a two year and six month-long pilot program requiring DOHMH, in consultation with ACS, to provide free mental health services to children who have been returned home following their removal by ACS. This bill requires DOHMH, in consultation with ACS, to provide culturally appropriate outreach about the services provided through the pilot program, and to provide a pilot feasibility report to council, no later than one year after this legislation takes effect.

Effective Date: 180 days after enactment. Expires and deemed repealed 3 years after enactment.

DOHMH and ACS would require both Personnel Services (PS) and Other Than Personnel Services (OTPS) funding to operate the pilot program.

The anticipated Personal Service (PS) cost is \$460,000 to cover 4 new program supervision staff (excluding fringe).

The anticipated Other Than Personal (OTPS) cost is \$3,540,000 to contract with Article 31 clinics to provide mental health services to approximately 1,600 children who experience removals annually. This OTPS cost estimate includes training and program oversight activities.
