Wonderful, thank you.

Today, the Committee is voting on Proposed Intro. 1002, sponsored by Council Member

Kristy Marmorato. This bill would require all schools
to stock airway clearance devices within 180 days
after one airway clearance device received
authorization from the FDA for use as choking rescue
device during choking emergencies for school-aged
children and either American Heart Association or the
American Red Cross issue choking rescue protocols
that recommend the way the use of airway clearance
devices using during choking emergencies for school-
aged children. Additionally, each school year, this
bill would require the Department of Education to
report the number of airway clearance devices made
possible in each school building and number of
instance airway clearance devices were used during ar
emergency disaggregated by school building.

COUNCIL MEMBER MARMORATO: Chair, I just wanted to say thank you so much, and I just wanted to thank the Members of the Committee for hearing the bill at the hearing and pushing this forward to a vote.
