SERGEANT-AT-ARMS: This is a microphone test. Today's date, June 11, 2025, for the vote on Land Use in the Committee Room, being recorded by John Biondo.

Chair Salamanca, we are ready to begin.

CHAIRPERSON SALAMANCA: [GAVEL] All right.

Good afternoon, and welcome to the Committee on Land

Use. I am Council Member Rafael Salamanca, Chair of

this Committee. I would like to welcome my esteemed

Colleagues who have joined us today. We've been

joined by Council Member Moya, Rivera, Chair Riley,

Majority Whip Brooks-Powers, Abreu, Majority Leader

Farías, Chair Hanks, Hudson, and Sanchez.

I would like to thank Chair Riley and Chair Hanks for their ongoing leadership in our two Subcommittees.

Today, we are voting on two proposals referred out by our Zoning Subcommittee. We will vote to approve a Pre-Considered LU on the application number G 250076 XAQ for the Ocean Crest Article XI tax exemption request related to property in Majority Whip Brooks-Powers' District in Queens. The application will facilitate the development as a 100 percent affordable housing home ownership project

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with approximately 89 units. And we'll also vote to approve the modifications LUs 287 and 288 regarding the Grace Houses proposal related to property in Council Member Nurse's District in Brooklyn. The proposal consists of a zoning map and a zoning text amendment, which together will facilitate the development of two 100 percent affordable buildings of five and seven stories with a total of 135 affordable units in East New York. Our modifications will be to limit the proposal to an MIH Option 3 to ensure that at least 20 percent of the apartments are affordable to families making an average of 40 percent of the average median income, and we'll also modify the zoning map amendment to remove portions of Block 3705 within the original rezoning area with frontage on New Jersey Avenue. The excluded area would remain under R5B rezoning, which is more in keeping with the affected buildings and consistent with the built context to the south and southeast of the rezoning area.

I would now like to recognize any of my Colleagues who would like to make any remarks.

vote in support of the Ocean Crest Article XI tax
exemption, an important step toward realizing a
historic affordable homeownership project in Far
Rockaway. Ocean Crest is the first 100 percent
affordable homeownership development in the Rockaways
in over a decade, and one of the few opportunities
for working class families, especially Black and
Brown New Yorkers, to build equity in a city that is
becoming increasingly unaffordable. This project has
shaped through months of negotiation, and I'm proud
that the final agreement includes major community
benefits, including 50 percent local hiring from
Community Board 14, 35 percent M/WBE contracting, a

2	labor monitor and use of union labor, stormwater				
3	infrastructure improvements, and outreach to NYCHA				
4	residents for homeownership opportunities. These are				
5	wins for the people of Far Rockaway, and a model for				
6	how we can move development forward with				
7	accountability and equity at the center. I thank my				
8	Colleagues in government for their support,				
9	especially Congressman Meeks, Senator Sanders,				
10	Assemblymember Anderson, and Community Board 14 for				
11	helping us deliver a project that meets the moment.				
12	With today's vote, we are moving closer to a more				
13	stable, more just future for Southeast Queens, and				
14	thank you.
