CHAIRPERSON HOLDEN: [GAVEL] Thank you, Sergeant. Good morning. I am Council Member Robert Holden, Chair of the Committee on Veterans.

Resolution No. 441, sponsored by Council Member

Kristy Marmorato, designating March 29th annually as

Vietnam Veterans Day in the City of New York. This

day, we will honor the bravery and sacrifice of the

Americans who served and recognize the past and

present dedication of their families and caregivers.

The Committee originally heard this Resolution on

June 18, 2024. As we just honored Veterans Day this

week and observed November as National Veterans and

Military Families Appreciation Month, this Resolution is a timely recognition of our service members and their families. In this proclamation commemorating this month, President Biden said, "To all the mothers and fathers, sisters and brothers, sons and daughters, spouses and partners, and loved ones who stand alongside our veterans and service members, you are the solid steel spine that bears up under every burden and the courageous heart that rises to every challenge. Our nation has only one truly sacred obligation, to prepare those we send into harm's way and care for them and their families while they are deployed and when they return home."

Now, I would like to ask Council Member Marmorato to provide remarks on her Resolution.

COUNCIL MEMBER MARMORATO: Thank you,

Chair Holden and Members of the Veterans Committee.

It's a privilege to bring this Resolution forward, a

Resolution that holds deep significance for me and

for so many in District 13. Today, we're considering

designating March 29th as Vietnam Veterans Day in New

York City, a gesture that may seem simple, but one

that has a profound meaning for our veterans and

their families. The inspiration for this Resolution

came from a heartfelt conversation with one of my constituents, Oscar Ruiz, at a Veterans Breakfast in Morris Park. Oscar shared with me the struggle he and so many other Vietnam veterans have faced for years, especially the pain of returning home to a nation that did not offer them the recognition or support that they deserved. Hearing this story was powerful, a powerful reminder that as a city, we have a responsibility to do better. By designating March 29th as Vietnam Veterans Day, we're making a commitment, a promise to our Vietnam veterans and their families that their service, sacrifice, and resilience will not be forgotten. This day will serve as a constant reminder that New York City honors them, sees them, and values the contributions they continue to make in our communities. Passing this Resolution is about more than adding a date to our City's calendar. It's about restoring the respect and honor our Vietnam veterans have always deserved but are too often denied. True honor is more than a statement. It's a commitment to support and recognize those who have served not just on one day, but every day. Even today, I'm proud that in District 13, we are hosting a Department of Veterans Service event in

our office to provide support for all veterans and their families. It's one of many ways my District is committed to standing with our veterans and honoring their legacy of service. I ask my Colleagues on the Committee to support this Resolution and help move it forward to a full Council vote. Let's pass this for Oscar and every other Vietnam veteran who deserves to feel the City's gratitude. I'd like to take a moment to thank Regina Paul, April Cardena, and to all of our vets out there. Thank you.

Member. For those of us who lived through the Vietnam War, it remains an indelible memory, and we all remember the nightly newsreels, the people who knew with boots on the ground, the protests in the streets and on campuses, and the names of the faraway places that became synonymous with battle and sacrifice were all part of our everyday lives and then we'd get the scroll of the casualties of the day on TV every night on the nightly news. So, the service members who returned home often did not receive the accolades given to troops from previous wars, and that's been really the symbol of the Vietnam War. It was a very unpopular war at the time, but the service members

who went there and served, again, did not come back
to parades. Many struggled to speak about what they
endured, and some, for many, the struggle continues.
The Vietnam Veterans Memorial on the National Mall in
Washington serves as a stark reminder of over 58,000
service members who were killed in the war, and we
must not forget the 1,600 service members who remain
missing.

I want to take a moment to thank my Staff and the Committee Staff for their hard work in preparing for today's hearing and vote, Daniel Kurzyna, my Chief-of-Staff; John LaRosa to my left here, the Committee's Legislative Counsel; Regina Paul, the Committee's Policy Analyst who drafted the Resolution; and Ross Goldstein, the Committee's Financial Analyst.

I just want to recognize my Colleagues who are on the Veterans Committee who are present today, Council Member Joann Ariola, Council Member Vickie Paladino, Council Member Sandy Nurse, and Council Member Marmorato.
