Summary of Legislation: This bill requires the Department of Information Technology and Telecommunications (DOITT) to develop and publish on its website an internet master plan for expanding access to broadband internet in homes throughout the city. The plan shall include information about how the department may work with current cable telecommunications franchisees and other internet service providers, including but not limited to nonprofit or community-based internet service providers, to facilitate the provision of low-cost internet in homes, and shall prioritize recommendations for expansion of broadband internet in underserved areas. The bill also establishes an internet advisory board comprised of 8 members who will serve without compensation.

# **Impact on Expenditures (Expense):**

It is anticipated that DOITT would require \$1,000,000 in one-time Other than Personal Service (OTPS) resources to contract a consultant to conduct the initial assessment and associated analysis regarding potential new broadband services and infrastructure. Note that the consultant cost will vary depending on the number and complexity of potential opportunities for broadband expansion identified in the initial assessment, as this will impact the scope of the consultant's subsequent analysis. If the assessment yields a significantly large scope, the cost could be as high as \$5,000,000.
