2 SERGEANT-AT-ARMS: This is a microphone 3 check for the vote on the Committee on Criminal Justice, located in the Committee Room, recorded on 4 5 May 28, 2025, by Pat Kurzyna. 6 SERGEANT-AT-ARMS: Good morning and 7 welcome to today's New York City Council vote for the 8 Committee on Criminal Justice. 9 At this time, we ask that you please silence all electronic devices, and at no time is 10 11 anyone to approach the dais. 12 Chair Nurse, we're ready to begin. 13 CHAIRPERSON NURSE: [GAVEL] Good morning, 14 and welcome to today's 9 a.m. vote on Proposed 15 Introduction Number 412-A, sponsored by Council Member Restler, which would establish procedures for 16 17 Correctional Health Services to notify emergency 18 contacts and attorneys of record when an individual 19 in custody attempts suicide, is hospitalized, or is 20 seriously injured. 21 I would like to recognize my colleagues, 22 Council Member Abreu, Restler, Marte, Ayala, 23 Mercedes, Cabán, and Hanif Online. 24 I'm going to turn it over to Council Member Restler to give a short statement. 25

2	COUNCIL MEMBER RESTLER: Thank you so
3	much, Chair Nurse. I really appreciate the
4	opportunity to speak today. And I really want to just
5	note, Intro. 412-A, it's a vital bill to bring peace
6	of mind to so many families that have loved ones on
7	Rikers Island. There are over 1,500 serious injuries
8	on Rikers every single day, but there's no formal
9	notification process to let family members know what
10	the heck is going on. Families often find out about
11	hospitalizations until another individual in custody
12	lets them know. Under this legislation, the
13	Correctional Health Services will be required to call
14	a designated emergency contact and the detainee's
15	attorney every time an individual is hospitalized or
16	seriously injured. Violence continues to be far too
17	commonplace on Rikers Island. The rate of stabbings
18	and slashings in our jails has more than quadrupled
19	since the time the Nunez Monitor went into place in
20	2016. There were 330 stabbings and slashings last
21	year. That means essentially every single day someone
22	on Rikers Island is stabbed or slashed. Use of force
23	incidents have remained extraordinarily high. More
24	than 1,700 incidents last year alone doubled the rate
25	from when the Nunez Monitor came into effect a decade

ago. There are almost 1,000 documented serious 2 3 injuries every year. In the most recent Nunez 4 reporting period, only two in five people in custody made it to scheduled medical appointments. Sixty 5 percent of medical appointments were missed. It's 6 7 essential that families have this vital information 8 about their loved ones so they can best advocate for 9 their health and safety.

I'd particularly like to thank the team 10 11 from the Freedom Agenda, in particular Sarita Daftary and Jennifer Parrish for their advocacy. And most of 12 13 all, I just want to thank the family members and the 14 people who have been through our criminal justice 15 system, shared their personal experience, and worked 16 tirelessly to try to make our criminal justice system 17 more fair, more just, and more functional.

With that, I'd also like to thank Committee Counsel Jeremy Whiteman, who was incredibly helpful in the drafting of this bill, and my Chiefof-Staff, Molly Haley, who's superb. Thank you, Chair Nurse, and thank you all for the Committee Members for your support.
