CHAIRPERSON SALAMANCA: [GAVEL] All right, good afternoon, and welcome to the Committee on Land Use. I am Council Member Rafael Salamanca, Chair of this Committee. I would like to welcome my esteemed Colleagues who have joined us today. We've been joined by Council Member Moya, Rivera, Chair Riley, Brooks-Powers, Abreu, Majority Leader Farías, Hudson, Sanchez, and Borelli.

Today, we are voting on a number of items recommended by our Landmark Subcommittee and, as always, I want to thank Chair Hanks and also Chair Riley for their ongoing leadership.

Today, we are voting on three landmark designations by LPC, including two in Manhattan and one in Staten Island. Today, we will vote to approve LU 108 related to the Heckscher Building, now known as Crown Building, in Council Member Powers' District in Manhattan. Once a pioneering example of urban skyscraper architecture and a rare example of a building designed to meet the zoning regulations of 1916, today the Crown Building accommodates a wide range of uses, including retail in the lower floors and residential above.

We will also vote to approve LU 129 related to the Temple Court Atrium, now the Beekman Hotel in Council Member Marte's District, just one of the other sides of City Hall Park. The building is the city's earliest remaining fireproof office building and a rare example of a commercial structure around a full height exterior skylighted atrium, which will now be protected as an interior landmark.

2	Finally, we will also vote to approve LU			
3	131 related to the Frederick Douglass Memorial Park			
4	in Council Member Carr's District in Staten Island.			
5	The site, which remains an active cemetery, is the			
6	only existing non-sectarian cemetery founded by and			
7	specifically for New York City's black community. The			
8	site includes a monumental sculpture honoring			
9	Frederick Douglass, the prominent abolitionist,			
10	social reformer, and statesman for which it is named.			
11	Now, are there any Members from the panel			
12	that wish to ask questions or have comments?			
13	Seeing none, I will now call for a vote			
14	with support of the local Members to approve LUs 108,			
15	129, and 131. Will the Clerk please call the roll?
