21	here. And also, now the whole environment is so
22	against immigrants, and we need to talk about those
23	immigrants' stories and cherish their history and

3 CHAIRPERSON RIVERA: Thank you, Council Member4 Zhuang. Well said, thank you very much.

And let me just say a few words about my 5 Resolution Number 741, this resolution is about the 6 7 brilliant and talented Judith Jamison, a dance icon who did it all. She performed on Broadway, on stages 8 9 across the country, and on most continents, usually to a standing ovation. She danced with Mr. Ailey's 10 11 company for 15 years and led it for another 21. Mr. Ailey choregraphed what would become her signature 12 solo cry, a legendary tribute to, as Mr. Ailey said, 13 14 "...all Black women everywhere, especially our 15 mothers." Mr. Jamison was also the genius behind 16 building the state of the art Ailey headquarters at 17 West 55th Street and 9th Avenue, after bringing Mr. 18 Ailey's company into a financially stable future. She 19 was much loved by Ailey dancers and staff for 20 decades.

I would like to thank my staff, as well as the Committee staff who worked on preparing this legislation including Katie Loeb, my Chief of Staff; Edward Amador, Director of Legislation; Christina Yellamaty, Committee's Counsel; Regina Paul, the
