Today, we will consider two candidates for appointment by the Mayor that are subject to the advice and consent of the Council.

Before we begin, I recognize Speaker Adrienne Adams to offer remarks.

SPEAKER ADAMS: Thank you very much,
Majority Leader, and good morning, everyone.

Last month, when Mayor Adams' Office contacted the Council to inform us that they intend to nominate 14 candidates for appointments to various boards with terms lasting into the next decade, we told them we would not grant them our advice and consent. Nonetheless, on October 24th, ignoring the request of my Office, the Mayor sent 10 letters to the Council requesting this Body's advice and consent for appointments to the City Planning Commission, the Board of Health, and the Environmental Control Board. After the general election, we reached out again to the Mayor's Office to tell them that out of deference to the incoming mayoral administration, we would not

COMMITTEE ON RULES, PRIVILEGES AND ELECTIONS be approving any of the Mayor's requests for advice and consent, and that they should be withdrawn. The Mayor's Office did nothing. My Office reached out to the candidates themselves and explained that our decision to disapprove their candidacies had nothing to do with their qualifications and that they might be appointed by the next mayor. We explained that for candidates who were being reappointed, the Council's action would have no impact on their current roles. The public offices law requires them to hold over in their offices until or unless they are replaced. In response, almost all of the candidates wrote to the Mayor asking him to withdraw their names from consideration. Yesterday, the Mayor sent letters withdrawing eight of the candidates from consideration, but his office refused to withdraw the nominations of Dr. Mitchell Katz and Dr. David Chokshi, two candidates for the Board of Health, whose appointments, if approved, would last until the middle of 2030.

hearing on these candidates as required. We have not
invited the candidates to make opening statements.

All members of the public who sign up to speak today will be limited to two minutes each. After the public testimony has concluded, I ask my Colleagues to exercise their democratic prerogative to reject these nominations by voting to approve resolutions recommending the Council disapprove the Mayor's request for advice and consent. The Mayor's Office has attempted to characterize this process as undemocratic. The undemocratic choice would be to do nothing and let the Mayor influence City agencies and these boards into the next decade. Elections have consequences and this is what democracy looks like. Thank you very much, Majority Leader, and with that, I turn it back over to you.

ACTING CHAIRPERSON FARÍAS: Thank you so much, Speaker Adams.

We will now move on to the public hearings on two nominations by the Mayor for the New York City Board of Health. Pursuant to Sections 31 and 553 of the Charter and by letters dated October 28, 2028, requested the advice and consent of the

Council regarding the reappointment of Dr. Mitchell

Katz and the new appointment of Dr. Dave Chokshi to

the New York City Board of Health. Both appointments

would expire on May 31st, 2030.

I will now open the floor to the public for comments. Members of the public are invited to provide testimony about either or both of the candidates. If you wish to speak, please fill out an appearance card with the Sergeant-at-Arms and you will be given an opportunity to make your comment. If you have a written statement with you, please provide a copy of that statement to the Sergeant at Arms.

Public testimony will be limited to two minutes total. If you have additional information for the Committee to consider, you can submit it for the record within 72 hours via the web at council.nyc.gov/testify.

DAVID CHOKSHI: Well, thank you, Speaker

Adams, Chair Powers, and Council Members for hearing

my brief testimony. My name is Dave Chokshi. I'm a

physician at Bellevue Hospital, professor at CUNY,

and previously served as the 43rd Health Commissioner

of New York City through much of the COVID-19

pandemic, leading our historic vaccination campaign.

As Health Commissioner, I had the privilege of Chairing the Board of Health. Therefore, I have deep and direct knowledge of the Board's vital function in safeguarding the well-being of our fellow New Yorkers. I'm honored to have been asked to join the board again, especially in these challenging times for public health, given the headwinds we face at the national level. While I understand the Council's position regarding nominations before this Committee, I respectfully disagree. Bodies like the Board of Health are designed to rise above political transitions. Its work is long-term, continuous across administrations, and rooted in scientific expertise. That continuity is essential to maintaining trust in public health, and in fact, trust in each of us who work in government in service to our fellow New Yorkers. For that reason, I respectfully believe

COMMITTEE ON RULES, PRIVILEGES AND ELECTIONS 9 appointments to the Board should be considered on their merits independent of the political calendar.

It has been a privilege to serve our City in various roles over more than a decade now. I would look forward to the chance to do so through the Board of Health. Thank you so much for your time and for your commitment to our City.

Does anyone else have any comments virtually?

Seeing no one else signed up to testify, the public hearing on these candidates is now closed.

We will vote on the following items. M182, a Resolution to disapprove the reappointment by
the Mayor of Dr. Mitchell-Katz as a member of the New
York City Board of Health to serve for the remainder
of a six-year term that expires on May 31, 2030; and
M-184, a Resolution to disapprove the appointment by
the Mayor of Dr. Dave Chokshi, a member of the New
York City Board of Health, to serve for the remainder
of a six-year term that expires on May 31, 2030.
