SERGEANT-AT-ARMS: Good morning and welcome to today's remote New York City Council hearing for the Committee on Transportation. At this time, would all panelists please turn on their video for verification purposes. And to minimize disruptions, please place all electronic devices to vibrate or silent mode. Thank you for cooperation. Chair Rodriguez, we are ready to begin.

CHAIRPERSON RODRIGUEZ: Thank you. Thank you,
Sergeants and everyone in the tech field, the Council
for allowing us to be... being hold in this hearing
and to connect all New Yorkers to the best in our
City Council.

Good morning. Thank you for joining the

Committee on Transportations hearing to vote on

Proposed Intro. Number 2061-A. It appears that I

have a sponsor that would amend administrative code

for the City of New York in relation to mark share

system. I also want to give credit to Congressman

Espaillat with whom I been working for so many

months... months in this bill and Speaker Johnson, my colleague for being part in this initiative. In recent years, in particularly during the pandemic, we have seen an increase in the use of alternative modes of transportation within the city. Because of this, the Committee of Transportation has worked tirelessly to pass legislation to regulate this increasingly popular ways of getting around.

Notably in June of 2020, the Committee passed a package of bills that legalized a certain type of escooter and e-bikes within New York City. In addition to e-bikes and e-scooters, mopeds offer riders yet another way to travel through the city without vehicle.

Since mopeds can be registered within the DMV, they are already legal to ride on our streets as long as riders meet certain criteria and also the rules of the road. Companies like Revel and Lime uh enter this space and provide shared electrical motor services which have expanded access to these devices. Last summer, we saw a strain of mopeds crashes leading to the dead and serious injury in multiple New Yorkers. As the Chairman of the Transportation

Committee the safety of all pedestrian and cyclists
and moped riders have been my top priority.

Currently, DOT lack the authority to regulate these services. I believe it is crucial that we balance our goal of expanding access to alternative motor transportation with consent for the safety of all New Yorkers. My bill does just that. From Intro. Proposal Intro. 2061-A will prohibit operation of moped share system without DOT approval.

Requiring moped share system operators to obtain a permit for each in their fleet, require DOT to promulgate rules and safety and riders compliance with local and state law including helmet use monitoring, limit moped share systems to mopeds incapable of exceeding 30 mile-per-hour and create penalty and provide for the improvements of authorized mopeds.

I'm very proud to be the sponsor of this important bill and happy that we are voting it out of Committee today. And again, thank you Congressman Espaillat. Thank you, Speaker Johnson. Thank you to my colleagues who'll be working with support of this bill. [SPEAKING IN SPANISH 03:40-4:10].

I will now ask the Committee Clerk to conduct a roll call vote on the Proposed bill and recommend that my colleague vote yes on this important piece legislation.
