Council vote for the Committee on Finance.

Chair, we are ready to begin.

CHAIRPERSON BRANNAN: Thank you. [GAVEL]
Okay, good morning and welcome to today's Finance
Committee meeting. I'm Council Member Justin Brannan.
I have the privilege of Chairing the Committee on
Finance. We've been joined this morning, Council
Members Salaam, Brewer, Ayala, Farías, Carr, Hudson,
Powers, Hanks, Won, Louis, Ossé, Stevens; on Zoom,
Brooks-Powers and Moya.

Today, the Committee will be voting on five items. Resolution 627, Resolution 630, two Property Tax Exemption Resolutions, and a Transparency Resolution.

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riist, kesolution 627, sponsoled by me,
concerns scheduling the public hearing required to
increase the annual expenditure for nine Business
Improvement Districts as follows: The 34th Street BID
at 14,300,000 dollars; the Times Square BID at
17,200,000 dollars; the North Flatbush Avenue BID at
350,000 dollars; the Madison 23rd Street Flatiron
Chelsea BID at 9 million; and the Bayside Village BID
at 430,000 dollars. But wait, there's more. Fulton
Street BID at 800,000 dollars; the Hudson Square BID
at 5.85 million dollars; the Atlantic Avenue BID at
637,000 dollars; and finally, the Soho Business
Improvement District at 1,757,934 dollars.

Member Powers, concerns scheduling the public hearing required to amend the district plan of the Madison Avenue BID to allow for a change in the assessment method of the BID's district charge and to increase the annual expenditure to 2.52 million dollars. In both cases, the Resolution set the date, time, and place for a public hearing on December 19, 2024, 1030 a.m., in the City Council Committee Room. At that public hearing, we'll consider two proposed local laws that would increase the annual expenditures of

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the nine BIDs and would amend the Madison Avenue district plan and increase the BID's annual expenditure, respectively.

Next, the first Property Tax Exemption
Resolution is for a new full Article XI exemption,
retroactive to July 1, 2024, for the preservation of
seven rental buildings in Council Member Rivera,
Menin, and Powers Districts. As part of the
exemption, all buildings will combine into one
unified HDFC ownership and will be designated as
senior affordable housing. The buildings will also
complete necessary projects under Local Laws 11 and
97.

Second Property Tax Exemption today is a new full 40-year Article XI exemption for preservation of one HDFC co-op building in Council Member Abreu's District. Upon approval, the building will undergo energy efficiency upgrades, moderate rehabilitation, and enter into an HPD regulatory agreement imposing affordability restrictions on the units.

Finally, the Transparency Resolution today sets forth the new designation and changes in the designation of certain organizations receiving

local youth, community safety, and victim services
funding and Speakers Initiative discretionary funding
and funding pursuant to certain initiatives in the
budget. As with all Transparency Resolutions, Council
Members will have to sign a disclosure form
indicating whether or not a conflict exists with any
of the groups on the attached list. If a Council
Member has a potential conflict of interest with any
of the organizations listed, they'll have an
opportunity to disclose the conflict at the time of
their vote. As a reminder, please disclose any
conflicts you may have with proposed subcontractors
used by organizations sponsored by discretionary
funding. These disclosures must be made before the
subcontractor can be approved. Disclosure forms must
be completed and submitted prior to the vote on
Transparency Resolution and may be emailed to Everton
Smith, who is with us today somewhere, to answer your
questions.
