Proposed Intro No. / Title: *Int. 1454 / Testing and remediating PFAS chemicals in firehouse drinking water.*

Sponsors: Ariola

Committee: Fire and Emergency Management

Summary of Legislation: This bill would require the New York City Fire Department (FDNY) to test drinking water from all fixtures used for drinking in firehouses to determine whether, and at what levels, PFAS chemicals are present. Testing must commence in conjunction with the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP). FDNY would be responsible for remediation where elevated levels of PFAS chemicals are detected.

Effective Date: One year after enactment

Impact on Expenditures (Expense):

FDNY does not currently test for PFAS at individual locations, rather DEP performs PFAS testing at their treatment facilities.

It is anticipated that it would cost FDNY up to \$6,990,000 annually to install a filtration system at approximately 223 firehouse location. Maintenance cost is estimated at \$450,000.

The one-time cost of a full filtration system installation is up to \$30,000 per site, with annual maintenance fees at approximately \$2,000 per site.

FDNY estimates the cost of testing drinking water at firehouse locations at up to \$2,000 per site.
