2	CHAIRPERSON ARROYO: Good morning,
3	everyone. My name is Maria del Carmen Arroyo,
4	chair of the Committee on Health, and we are here
5	today, and the Committee will be voting on pre-
6	considered resolution sponsored by Council Member
7	Gale Brewerwho we will hear from in a minute-
8	which calls upon the United States Congress to
9	pass and the President to reauthorize an
10	adequately funded Farm Bill that creates a strong
11	and health food system. In New York City, more
12	than 1/5 of the population lives at or below the
13	city poverty line. The 2012 reauthorization of
14	the Farm Bill provides critical opportunity to
15	address hunger and improve food access, positively
16	impact the economy and protect the environment.
17	One program authorized by the Farm Bill is the
18	Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program
19	otherwise known as SNAP and commonly known as food
20	stamps, which is a critical safety net for more
21	than 1.8 million New Yorkers. SNAP also provides
22	benefits to the local economy for every \$1 in
23	benefits generates \$1.80 in local economy
24	activity. The Senate has proposed cutting funding
25	for SNAP by almost \$4.5 billion; whereas, the

House proposal suggests reducing SNAP funding by
\$160 billion. Unfortunately many individuals
enrolled in SNAP have their benefits run out
before the end of this month, forcing them to rely
on emergency food programs that are already at
capacity. Although the Senate proposed increasing
funding for emergency food programs, the amount
proposed is insufficient to make up the drastic
cut imposed in the last year. This pre-considered
reso would call on the federal government to
adequately fund both SNAP and the emergency food
program. In addition the pre-considered reso
seeks to ensure that other noteworthy programs,
including community food projects, competitive
grant programs, senior farmers market, nutrition
programs, healthy food financing initiative are
protected and calls on the federal government to
expand the use of wireless electronic benefit
transfers, processing in farmer's markets and
community supported agricultural programs. We are
also concerned with programs that directly help
farmers such as the farmers' market promotion
program, value added producer grants and the
beginning farmer and rancher development program.

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The impact of these programs in the production of good jobs, good food, that's what we're looking

for. Council Member Brewer?

COUNCIL MEMBER BREWER: First of all, thank you very much, Council Member Arroyo and we're following up on the good works done by Speaker Quinn to promote healthy food in the city of New York. The Chair of this Committee, Council Member Arroyo, listed all the issues. I think that it is a bill that is incredibly robust in trying to solve some of our hunger and access to healthy, local food, environmental protection and to build the local economy as you indicated, and certainly, we should not have any cut to food stamps whatsoever. I think this resolution as you suggest urges the federal support for all of these important programs and this bill--that we want a bill that would support a robust food system in New York City and across the United States and particularly the ability to work with our upstate farmers and our local consumers and address those who have a challenging food situation. very much, and I appreciate those who are here will support this resolution. Thank you.
