Sponsors: Feliz and Louis **Committee:** Public Safety

Summary of Legislation: Requires all New York Police Department (NYPD) personnel engaged in parking enforcement activities to confirm the validity of license plates and vehicle identification numbers (VIN) of all vehicles observed with temporary license plates. Beginning January 15, 2026, and within 15 days of the end of each quarter, the department shall publish, on its website, a report on parking enforcement. The reports must include the following information for the prior quarter, disaggregated by police precinct: (i) the number of parking violations issued by the department and the reason for citation; (ii) the number of inquiries made to the New York State DMV in relation to confirming the validity of a license plate or VIN of a parked vehicle; (iii) the number of parked vehicles found to be in violation of state requirements relating to the display of license plates or VIN; (iv) the number of parked vehicles immobilized by the department along with the underlying citation; and (v) the number of parked vehicles towed by the department along with the underlying citation.
