**Committee:** Fire and Emergency Management

**Summary of Legislation:** Requires that the Fire Department of the City of New York (FDNY) in consultation with New York City Emergency Management develop and maintain a residential fire emergency response guide. The guide must include information on resources for persons displaced by residential fires, city agencies responding to residential fires, details about post-fire inspections, landlord duties following a fire, renter's insurance best practices in case of residential fires, and details of tenant protections. The guide must be distributed to tenants at all post-fire inspection locations and to persons displaced by such fires in the citywide languages.
