Marin, in the Committee Room on July 14, 2025.

Welcome to the New York City Council Committee Vote on Land Use.

SERGEANT-AT-ARMS: Good afternoon.

At this time, we ask that you please silence all electronics, and at no point, please do not approach the dais.

Chair, you may begin.

CHAIRPERSON SALAMANCA: [GAVEL] All right.

Good afternoon. I am Council Member Rafael Salamanca.

I chair this Committee. I would like to welcome my
esteemed Colleagues who have joined us today. We've
been joined by Council Member Rivera, Chair Riley,
Majority Whip Brooks-Powers, Abreu, Majority Leader
Farías, Hanks, Hudson, and Sanchez.

Today, we're voting on a number of proposals referred by our two Subcommittees. I would like to thank Chair Riley and Chair Hanks for their ongoing leadership.

First, we will vote to approve preconsidered LUs items for the Interior Landmark Designation of the Modulightor Building Apartment

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2 Complex in Council Member Powers' District in
3 Manhattan.

We will also vote to approve a PreConsidered LU item for the 993-995 Union Avenue
Cluster Amendment Request submitted by HPD to amend
the project summary related to a previously approved
project in my District in the Bronx.

We will vote to approve LUs 326 related to an application by the Mykonian House seeking a revocable consent to operate a sidewalk cafe located in Council Member Powers' District in Manhattan.

We will also vote to approve with modifications LU 327 related to an application by Ajo and Oregano Restaurant seeking a revocable consent to operate a sidewalk cafe located in Majority Leader Farías' District in the Bronx. Our modification would be to adjust the sidewalk cafe site plan to remove one of the originally proposed seating areas access points and to permit up to eight tables and 16 chairs and conditions that this layout complies with all applicable DOT sidewalk cafe rules.

Finally, we will vote with resolution to disapprove LUs 321, 322, and 323 regarding the Bally's Ferry Point Map Amendment Proposal related to

property in Council Member Marmorato's District in
the Bronx. The proposal seeks a zoning amendment for
the map parkland, a City map amendment, and
disposition authority for a non-exclusive easement
across City land. These actions are filed by the
applicant as a required step to compete for a State
gaming facility license. As we have seen through
other proposals, New York State intends by the end of
the year to award up to three downstate gaming
facility licenses including within the five boroughs.
Council Member Marmorato does not support the
approval of these applications. The Zoning
Subcommittee recommends disapproval of the Bally's
application. For these reasons and consent with
recommendations of the Zoning Subcommittee, there
will be a vote on the resolutions to disapprove these
actions.

I would like to recognize anyone who has any comments or statements to be made.

Council Member, you have a comment? I want to recognize Council Member Marmorato.

COUNCIL MEMBER MARMORATO: Okay. Thank you, Chair. Colleagues, I speak to you today as a representative of District 13. To state clearly and

firmly, I oppose this application. I've done the
work, I've sat with my community, with the applicant,
and with my Colleagues, and I've taken the meetings,
reviewed the proposal, and kept my door open for
discussion. But some of those discussions and
conversation came far too late. My community has made
it crystal clear they did not want a casino, and I
was elected to represent them, not outside interests.
This proposal is not true economic development. It is
a high-risk bet so, Colleagues, I ask you to stand
with me and District 13. This is about how we value
each other's communities and their wishes, especially
when the community's position is this unified, and I
urge you to vote in favor of the resolution
disapproving these applications. Thank you.

CHAIRPERSON SALAMANCA: Thank you, Council Member.

Any other members have any comments or statements?

Seeing none, I will now call for a vote on the following items with the support of the local Members. To approve LUs 326 for the Mykonian House; to approve two Pre-Considered LUs, one for the 993-995 Union Avenue Cluster Amendment, and one for the

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Modulightor Building Apartment Duplex exterior

3 landmark; also to disapprove LUs 321, 322, and 323

4 for the Bally's Ferry Point Map Amendment Proposal;

and to approve LU 327 for the Aro and Oregano

6 Sidewalk Café as modified.

And just to remind my Colleagues that a yes vote is to approve resolutions to disapprove the development proposed by Bally's in the Bronx.

CHAIRPERSON SALAMANCA: So, I just want to explain my vote here. You know, I want to first start saying that in terms of, I vote aye on all except for LUs 321, 322, and 323. And I want to say that this by no means means anything to disrespect you, Council Member. I think that you are an awesome Council Member, and you speak exactly for what your community needs in your community. But at times we just do not agree. And I think that this project is not just for Bally's, but it's for the economic development of the Borough of the Bronx. And that is why, in my opinion, the Bronx is always last in all indicators. That has

8	opinion, for Bally's to get a license, but we are				
9	voting to allow the process to continue, and we are				
10	missing an opportunity for the Bronx, and my no vote				
11	is an opportunity for the Bronx. Thank you.

I would like to thank the members of the public, my Colleagues, Land Use and Council Staff, and the Sergeant-at-Arms for attending today's hearing.
