CHAIRPERSON RECCHIA: Welcome to
today's Finance Committee hearing. My name is
Domenic M. Recchia, Jr. I'm the chair of this
wonderful Committee. At this time, I'd like to
recognize all the members that have joined us. To
my far left, we have Council Member Al Vann,
Council Member Robert Jackson, Council Member,
Gale Brewer. To my right, we have Council Member
Darlene Mealy, we have Council Member Leroy
Comrie, we have Council Member Oliver Koppell,
Council Member Karen Koslowitz and of course, my
good friend Council Member Joel Rivera, who I
missed. I'm sorry about that. We have from
Staten Island Council Member Vincent Ignizio and I
think we got everybody. As more Council Members
come, we will recognize those members.
Today we have a transparency
resolution, one Land Use item, a budget mod and
three property tax fixing resolutions. Let's
first start with the transparency resolution. The
transparency resolution makes mostly technical

clarification purposes, it is to be noted that				
organizations appearing in the resolutions that				
have not yet completed the prequalification				
process conducted by the Mayor's Office of				
Contract Services, by the Council or other				
government agencies are identified in the attached				
charts with an asterisk next to it. Additionally,				
as with all transparency resos, Council Members				
will have to sign disclosure form indicating				
whether or not a conflict exists. If any Council				
Member has potential conflict of interest with any				
organization listed, he or she may want to				
disclose that at the time of their vote.				

We also have an expense budget mod that is related to this transparency reso, as well as past transparency resolutions. This mod is our first budget mod relating to Fiscal 2012 Expense Budget that we adopted in June. This mod reallocates appropriations that were affected in the FY 2012 Adopted Budget to fund City Council initiatives. This mod only includes Council-related items and does not include any item from the administration. Without this modification many organizations would not get their funding.

Items in today's transparency reso that require

budget mod in order for their funding to move

forward are referenced in the charts with a double

asterisk.

Now let's move to the Land Use item. This Land Use item—the Kelly Street

Apartments, located in the Bronx in Council Member Maria del Carmen Arroyo's district. They'll receive a property tax exemption for the rehab of the property. The Kelly Street apartments will provide 79 units of rental housing for low-income families.

Our last three items on the agenda are three tax fixing resos. Under current law, no class shares of the real property tax levy can increase by more than 5% from the previous year's share. Governor Cuomo recently signed legislation at the Council's request setting the class shares cap for this year's property tax at 2.5%, rather than the state law default of 5%. Under the amended law, no class share of the real property tax levy can increase by more than 2.5% from the previous year's share. If the 2.5% cap were not adopted, then the 5% cap would apply and the

typical taxpayer bills for a Class 1 property				
would be \$97 higher. Class 2 is not affected by				
this action today. So today we're amending the				
three property tax fixing resos adopted on June				
29th, 2011 to help make New York City a little				
more affordable for Class 1 homeowners. I urge				
all of my colleagues to vote yes on these amended				
property tax resolutions. We are lowering the				
taxes. I want to state that very clear. Okay? -				
- from the Finance division is available to answer				
any questions you may have on the property tax				
reso. Preston Niblack, the director of the				
Finance Division, is here to answer any questions				
on the budget mod. Does anybody have any				
questions? Without seeing any questions, call the				
vote. I recognize Helen Diane Foster from the				
Bronx joined us.
