CHAIRPERSON STEVENS: Good morning and welcome to today's vote for Children and Youth

Committee. I'm Council Member Althea Stevens, Chair of the Committee.

I'm proud to present Proposal

Introduction 87-A for a vote today. This bill is an important step forward to ensure that we meet the needs of our most vulnerable youth, those who are becoming involved in the justice system. Passed in 2017, Raised Age Legislation was a landmark decision that recognized the needs of adopting a more rehabilitative approach for justice-involved youth, 16- and 17-year-olds. However, this shift comes with

the responsibility of ensuring that our system,
particularly the Children's Services, ACS, and the
Department of Probations are equipped with the
necessary data and insights to deliver the
appropriate services and interventions. This bill
will mandate the collection of arrest information,
demographics data, and increase the frequency of
reporting, all of which are critical steps for
oversight and resources, allocations and policy
development. But more than that, this bill is about
accountability and improvement. As we see more youth
entering secure detention facilities, there's an
urgent need to track their outcomes and ensure that
our interventions are not just punitive, but
constructive. We must be able to respond to their
needs with real solutions. This bill will help us do
just that. I urge my Colleagues to vote in favor of
this legislation as it aligns with our shared goals
of promoting better outcomes for justice-involved
youth in New York City.

I'd like to thank our Committee Staff for their hard work in preparing for this vote, Committee Counsel, Christina; Policy Analyst, Elizabeth; as well as my Staff.
