SERGEANT-AT-ARMS: Will the Zoom host please start the webinar?

ZOOM HOST: Webinar started.

SERGEANT-AT-ARMS: Good morning and welcome to the New York City Council vote of the Committee on Land Use.

At this time, can everybody please silence your cell phones and no one is to approach the dais.

Chair, we are ready to begin.

CHAIRPERSON SALAMANCA: [GAVEL] All right.

Good afternoon, and welcome to the Committee on Land

Use. I am Council Member Rafael Salamanca, Chair of

this Committee. I would like to welcome my Colleagues

who have joined us today. We've been joined by

Council Member Moya, Chair Riley, Majority Whip

Brooks-Powers, Council Member Abreu, Majority Leader

Farías, Chair Hanks, Hudson, and Sanchez. And we've

also been joined by Council Member Marmorato.

Today, we are voting on nine proposals referred out to us by our two Subcommittees. As

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always, I would like to thank Chair Riley and Chair
Hanks for their ongoing leadership.

We will vote to approve LU 343 and LU 344, two LPC designations related to former Whitney Museum of Art building in Council Member Powers' District in Manhattan. LU 343 designates the buildings as an individual landmark, and LU 344 designates the building's interior as an interior landmark.

We will vote to approve LUs 351 and 352 for the 350 Park Avenue proposal, also in Council Member Powers' District, which comprises two zoning special permits to facilitate the construction of a new commercial office tower which will rise to approximately 1,600 feet in height and which will contain a public concourse of over 12,000 square feet in Park Avenue.

We will also vote to approve LU 357 for the JFK Conduit Logistics Center demapping, an application for a change to the City map to facilitate the development of a proposed new logistics warehouse in Majority Whip Brooks-Powers' District in Queens.

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We will vote to approve LU 358 for the Broadway Junction station City map amendment, another City map amendment application to facilitate improvements to the expansion of the Broadway Junction subway station complex in Council Member Nurse's District in Brooklyn.

We will also vote to approve LUS 364 for the New York City Health and Hospital proposal known as Jacobi Just Home in Council Member Marmorato's District in the Bronx. The Health and Hospitals Enables Act requires the Council to approve the proposed lease for a parcel of land to the Fortune Society for the purpose of redeveloping the existing structure known as Building 2 on Jacobi Campus in the Bronx Community Board District 11 into an affordable and supportive housing development with a total of 83 residential units. The Board of Directors of the Health and Hospital has previously approved the lease for this proposal.

We vote to disapprove LUs 379 for sidewalk cafe application by El Caldero Restaurant and Sports Bar in Council Member Steven's District in the Bronx for the reasoning provided by Chair Riley at the Zoning Subcommittee.

3	sidewalk cafe application by Lava Rock Kitchen in
4	Majority Leader Farías' District in the Bronx.
5	Finally, we will vote to disapprove LUs
6	381 for the sidewalk cafe application by Green
7	Pavilion Restaurant and Sports Lounge in Council
8	Member Joseph's District in Brooklyn for the
9	reasoning provided by Chair Riley at the Zoning
10	Subcommittee.
11	Now, I would like to recognize any of my
12	Colleagues who would like to make any remarks.
13	Council Member Marmorato, would you like

15	COUNCIL MEMBER MARMORATO: Yes, please.
16	CHAIRPERSON SALAMANCA: All right.
17	COUNCIL MEMBER MARMORATO: Thank you,
18	Chair.
19	CHAIRPERSON SALAMANCA: Chair recognizes
20	Council Member Marmorato.

COUNCIL MEMBER MARMORATO: Thank you. For three years, I've done the work, held meetings, and heard concerns and fought for a process that respects both citywide needs and the people of my District, District 13. The Administration has already committed

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to relocating this project and expanding affordable housing at the Jacobi property. That is a compromise and that is what governing looks like. I ask you to vote no, stand with the work that we have done and that has been done, and stand with my community, stand with fairness. Thank you.

CHAIRPERSON SALAMANCA: I would also like to recognize Majority Whip Brooks-Powers.

MAJORITY WHIP BROOKS-POWERS: Thank you, Chair and the Members of the Committee. I want to speak today regarding the JFK Conduit Logistics Center project located in Springfield Gardens. I want to acknowledge the work Wildflower has done, particularly in partnership with Urban Upbound and the outreach they've conducted with local stakeholders. Their engagement demonstrates a commitment to the community and to address longstanding concerns, including flooding mitigation and truck traffic management. This project will create meaningful economic opportunities. During construction, it is expected to generate approximately 150 jobs and, once operational, 65 full-time and six part-time positions will be available. Importantly, the applicant has committed

to high labor standards, ensuring that these jobs		
provide good pay and safe working conditions for		
local residents. Additionally, the project is		
designed with sustainability in mind, incorporating		
solar technology, future electric vehicle charging		
infrastructure, and stormwater management		
improvements to mitigate flooding and reduce		
emissions. Truck access will adhere strictly to		
designated routes, minimizing impacts on local		
streets. Given the careful planning, the strong labor		
commitments, and the ongoing community engagement, I		
support moving this project forward and encourage my		
Colleagues on this Committee to approve the proposal.		
With responsible oversight, this development can		
deliver tangible benefits to Springfield Gardens		
while maintaining the integrity of the surrounding		
neighborhood. Thank you.
