SERGEANT-AT-ARMS: Good morning, good
morning, and welcome to today's Committee on Land
Use. This recording is done in the Committee Room.
Today's date is June 26, 2025, and this recording is
done by Ginelle Yearwood.

SERGEANT-AT-ARMS: Good afternoon, and welcome to the New York City hearing on the Committee on Land Use.

Please silent all electronic devices at this time.

Chair, we are ready to begin.

CHAIRPERSON SALAMANCA: [GAVEL] Good
afternoon, and welcome to the Committee on Land Use.

I am Council Member Rafael Salamanca. I chair this
Committee. I would like to welcome my esteemed
Colleagues who have joined us today. We've been
joined by Council Member Moya, Rivera, Chair Riley,
Abreu, Majority Leader Farías, Hudson, and Council
Member Tiffany Cabán.

Today we are voting on six proposals referred by our two Subcommittees, and I would like to thank Chair Riley and Chair Hanks for their ongoing leadership.

First, we will vote to approve preconsidered LU items for the Halletts Point, a 547- to 754-seat primary and intermediate school facility siting request submitted by the New York City School Construction Authority for a new school facility in Council Member Cabán's District in Oueens.

We will also vote to approve with modifications LUs 313 through 316 for the Carmen Villegas Apartments proposal related to property in Deputy Speaker Ayala's District in Manhattan. The proposal includes a zoning map amendment, zoning text amendment, acquisition of property by the City, and disposition of City-owned property, all of which together will facilitate the development of a new affordable housing development with approximately 210 units, including 147 affordable senior housing units. Our modification will be to remove MIH Option 2.

We will also vote to approve LUs 297 regarding the Coney development proposal related to property in Council Member Brannan's District in Brooklyn. The proposal seeks to amend the City map as one step in the process towards competing for a State gaming facility license. As we have seen through other proposals, New York State intends by the end of

the year to award up to three downstate gaming facility licenses, including within the five boroughs. As Chair Riley made clear in our Zoning Subcommittee, the action before us today is only one of a series of necessary steps and part of the lengthy process. The proposal requests modifications of the City map, including the demapping of streets, both at grade and within clearly defined air volumes above grade, along with the adjustment of grades throughout the project site.

We will also vote to approve with modifications LUs 298 through 299 regarding the North 7th Street rezoning proposal related to property in Council Member Gutiérrez's District in Brooklyn. The proposal includes a zoning map amendment and a related zoning text amendment, which together will facilitate a new mixed-use development with approximately 28 apartments, including six units as permanently affordable. Our modification will be to remove MIH Option 2.

We will also vote to approve with modifications LUs 300, 301, and 302 regarding the Marcus Garvey Boulevard rezoning proposal related to property in Council Member Ossé's District in

Brooklyn. The proposal includes a zoning map amendment, zoning text amendment, and a zoning special permit, which together will facilitate a new senior housing infill building with approximately 292 income-restricted units. Our modification will be to remove MIH Option 2 and add Option 3.

Finally, we will vote to approve with modifications LUs 294, 295, and 296 regarding the One45 for Harlem proposal related to property in Council Member Salaam's District in Manhattan. The proposal includes three related actions, a zoning map amendment, a zoning text amendment, and a zoning special permit, which would facilitate the development of a multi-building mixed-use development in Harlem. As discussed in more detail at our zoning Subcommittee vote, we are recommending modifications to all three related actions. The special permit approval is being modified to reflect programming and site plans changes across the three proposed new buildings, including the change to Building C into a 100 percent affordable senior housing building. The zoning text amendment is being modified to require MIH Option 1 for Building A and to retain Option 1 and 2 over the remainder of the rezoning area.

Lastly, the zoning map amendment will be modified so that the associated restrictive declaration will similarly reflect the revised height, density, and programming of Buildings A, B, and C to be consistent with the modified special permit approval. Together, these actions as modified will facilitate the large-scale general development project with approximately 1,000 total units, of which approximately 388 units will be permanently affordable.

I would like now to recognize any of my Colleagues who wish to make comments or remarks.

I recognize Council Member Tiffany Cabán.

COUNCIL MEMBER CABÁN: Thank you. I'm
honored to support the siting of a brand-new 100
percent ADA-accessible school in the Astoria Houses
campus in a section of my District that has long
experienced significant school overcrowding. This
siting has been in the works since 2013 as part of
the Greater Halletts Point Rezoning. I am so grateful
to all the community members, particularly the
Astoria Houses residents, who have provided critical
input on this project from the outset. I have immense
gratitude for the work that is carried out day in and
day out by our District 38 teachers and students. I'm

impressed by the care, dedication, and passion for
our neighborhood each and every day. Our students and
teachers deserve more space. They deserve state-of-
the-art equipment and facilities and smaller class
sizes. This future school will bring all of those
amenities and more to the neighborhood. We look
forward to this facility not only as an incredible
win for our teachers and students, specifically
students living in Astoria Houses, but also as a
cornerstone for the entire Astoria Houses community,
like exciting possible uses of the building include a
new polling site, a meal distribution center, and a
cooling center. It will also serve as a hub for civic
groups and a location where our Western Queens
community can enjoy the arts, entertainment, and
recreational events. As the project moves forward, I
am committed to continuing to work closely with
community members and the agencies involved to ensure
that this school is of the utmost service to its
students and neighbors for generations to come. So,
thank you, Chair.

CHAIRPERSON SALAMANCA: Thank you, Council Member.
