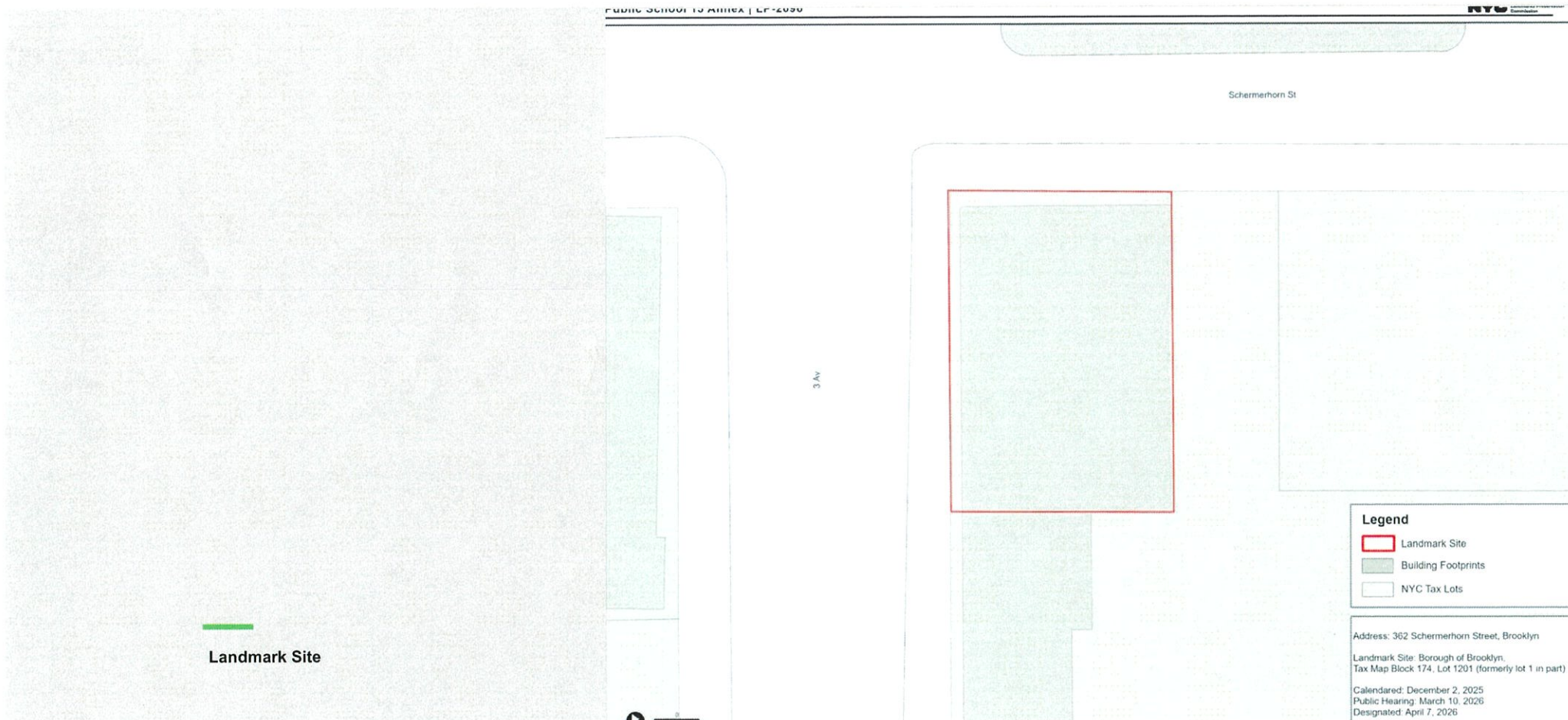

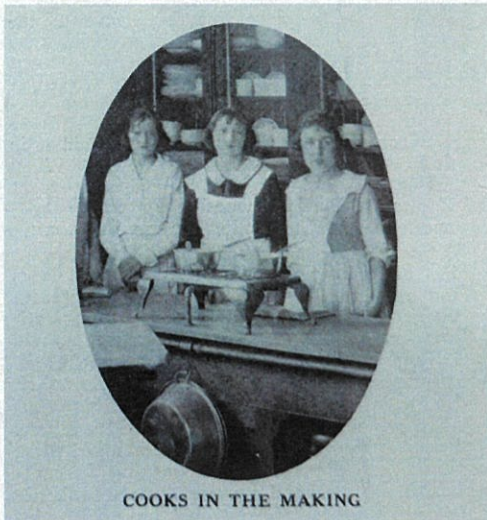
1892 View of School, Souvenir of

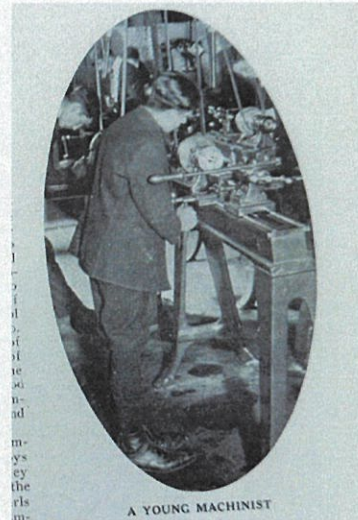

KEEPING GIRLS IN SCHOOL

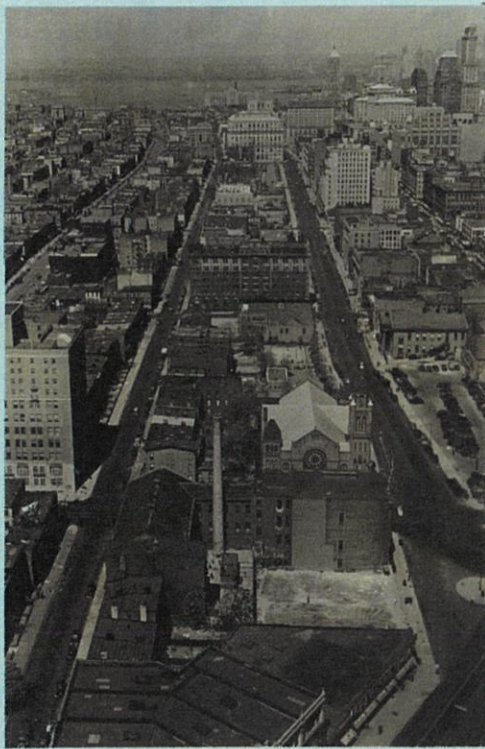

A PROPOS of the new continuation school law compelling boys and girls up to the age of 18, employed or unemployed, to continue studies, which goes into effect the first of the year, Miss Beatrice Doerschuk, vocational adviser for the New York City Young Women's Christian Association, brings out some appalling facts in a survey of the local situation. Seventy-three out of every hundred girls she says, never go beyond the eighth grade. Of the remaining twenty-seven
