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SERGEANT-AT-ARMS: Good morning, and welcome to today's New York City Council vote for the Committee on Civil Service and Labor.

At this time, we ask that you silence all electronic devices and at no time are you to approach the dais.

Chair De La Rosa, we're ready to begin.

CHAIRPERSON DE LA ROSA: [GAVEL] Good morning. I'm Council Member Carmen De La Rosa, Chair of the Committee on Civil Service and Labor. Today the Committee will be voting on the following legislative items ahead of the Council's final Stated Meeting of 2024. Proposed Intro. 265-A, sponsored by Council Member Joseph, which would improve benefits, enrollment process for City employees; Resolution 521, sponsored by Majority Leader Amanda Farías, which calls on the United States Department of Labor to expand the number of OSHA authorized outreach trainers in New York City to 10 designated languages; and Resolution 522, sponsored by Council Member Julie

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Menin, which calls on the New York State Legislature to pass and the Governor to sign A10225, also known as the Good Jobs Guarantee Act, which would establish certain workforce training programs and increase

6 employment opportunities for New Yorkers.

These bills and resolutions are designed to expand and strengthen our municipal workforce. Over the past year, the Committee has tackled critical issues affecting municipal workers, including pay disparities, high vacancy rates, and the administration of employee benefits. Together, this Committee and this Council have advanced robust legislation to improve the City and its workforce, and we will remain committed to building on this progress in 2025. I'd like to thank the Committee staff, Senior Policy Analyst Elizabeth Arzt, Legislative Counsel Rie Ogasawara, and Finance Analyst Michael Sherman for their work in preparing for this vote. I'd also like to thank my Staff, Chief-of-Staff James Burke, Legislative Director Kiana Diaz, and Comms Director Fray Familia.

I would like to recognize that we've been joined by Council Members Bottcher, Joseph, Salaam, Majority Leader Farías, Council Member Dinowitz,

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Council Member Hanks, and on Zoom, Council MembersCabán, Menin, Moya, and Feliz.

I now turn to Majority Leader Farías for her remarks on Resolution 521.

MAJORITY LEADER FARÍAS: Thank you so much, Chair De La Rosa.

Reso. 521 calls on the U.S. Department of Labor to expand the number of Occupational Safety and Health Administration, OSHA, authorized trainings and trainers in the 10 designated languages spoken across New York City. For many immigrant workers, particularly in construction and other hazardous industries, lack of access to safety training in their native language can be a matter of life or death. By calling for more trainers in multiple languages, we are taking an important step toward making sure immigrant workers can receive the critical safety training they need, training that complies with New York City's site safety training and OSHA standards. In industries where safety risks are high, especially construction, language barriers should never be the reason workers are not adequately trained, or worse, result in injury or death.

Expanding language access to OSHA trainers ensures

another. They often experience a gap in health

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2	insurance coverage. This is unacceptable as health
3	insurance is essential for their well-being and in
4	some cases, their survival. I urge you vote yes on
5	this bill, a problem that has affected hundreds of
6	City employees, including myself, over the years.
7	I want to thank my Colleagues on the
8	council for their support as well as my Staff and the
9	Council Team for their hard work in getting us to
10	this point. Thank you, Chair De La Rosa.
