Summary of Legislation: This legislation purports to authorize claims against entities brought under the Gender Motivated Violence Act (GMVA) that predate 2022, including claims predating the enactment of the GMVA in 2000. The bill seeks to create a "lookback" period for these claims for 18 months.
