SERGEANT-AT-ARMS: Good morning, and welcome to today's vote from the New York City Council Committee on Education.

At this point, I'd like to remind everyone to please silence their electronic devices, and at no point is anyone to approach the dais.

Chair, we are ready to begin.

Good morning, and welcome everyone. I'm Council
Member Rita Joseph, Chair of the Committee on
Education. First, I'd like to acknowledge my
Colleagues who are present, Council Member Louis,
Council Member Gennaro on Zoom, Council Member
Dinowitz, Council Member Krishnan, Council Member
Lee, Council Member Schulman, Council Member Stevens.
I think that's it.

Today, the Committee is voting on Proposed Resolution Number 501-A, sponsored by Council Member Shekar Krishnan. This proposed

resolution calls on the New York State Legislature to
pass, and the Governor to sign, A1080 and a companion
bill in the Senate to require school districts to
send water safety informational materials home to
students, parents, or guardians, and to permit school
districts to provide water safety instructions in
school for K-12 students. Lastly, a heartbreaking
number of children and teenagers drown in New York
City beaches. With nearly 520 miles of waterfront and
countless pools, stronger water safety instructions
in New York City is a necessity. According to the
Center for Disease Control and Prevention, drowning
is a leading cause of unintentional injury-related
death among children. For children ages one to four,
it is the number one cause. The fact that many New
York children enter adolescence without critical life
skills is a failure of our community. It is our duty
to ensure that every resident has the skills and
knowledge to safely enjoy our waters.

Council Member Shekar, would you like to make a statement?

COUNCIL MEMBER KRISHNAN: Thank you,
Chair. Good morning bright and early to my esteemed
Colleagues.

in 2024, New Yorkers died of drowning, a
record high since 2009. The need for water safety
education is a year-round, all-hands-on-deck mission
I'm proud that we are voting on my resolution,
Resolution 501, calling on the New York State
Legislature and Governor Hochul to educate our
students on swim safety by requiring schools to send
home resources. As Chair of the Parks Committee of
the New York City Council, I'm dedicated to ensuring
that our children and New Yorkers are safe while
swimming in pools and our beaches. One death due to
drowning is too much. Today, I hope we urge the State
to do statewide education, ensuring all our children
have information on water safety. Thank you, Chair,
and thank you to all my Colleagues who I urge to vote
yes on this resolution.
