The purpose of this hearing is to hold a vote on Proposed Intro. Number 3-A, sponsored by myself. The Committee previously heard Intro. Number 3 at a hearing on May 1, 2024, where it received testimony from representatives of the Department of Sanitation and interested members of the public. New

COMMITTEE ON SANITATION AND SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT York City constituents have been complaining for years about problems caused by vehicles parked on the street without license plates for an extended period of time, taking up space for parking and other public uses, complicating street cleaning, and contributing to negative perceptions of the city's cleanliness. A vehicle may be considered abandoned if it meets one of the criteria set out in New York State law, and certain abandoned vehicles can also be considered derelict if they don't have a license plate and are valued below a certain threshold. Under New York City's Administrative Code, vehicles that meet the criteria for abandoned but not derelict under State law are eligible to be towed by the New York City Police Department Rotation Tow Program. However, the Administrative Code does not expressly state which agency should handle derelict vehicle removals, leading to confusion and delay. Proposed Intro. Number 3-A would clarify that the New York City Department of Sanitation is the agency responsible for the removal of derelict vehicles from the street.
