Proposed Intro No. / Title: *Int 1036 / Requiring the DOC to provide reports regarding people in custody who have been ordered to undergo a mental health examination*

Sponsors: Nurse, Lee, Restler, Cabán, Louis, Brewer, Brannan, Narcisse and De La Rosa

Committee: Criminal Justice

Summary of Legislation: This bill would require the Department of Correction to issue quarterly public reports on court-ordered forensic psychiatric evaluations of people in custody. The report must include information on the number of people in custody with a pending psychiatric evaluation, the number of people in custody found medically unfit to stand trial, the number of rescheduled appointments, the number of in-person vs. virtual appointments, the length of time to complete a psychiatric evaluation from when the court order was received, and the length of time to discharge a person to a competency restoration institution from when the court order was received. Additionally, the report must disaggregate data by borough, the level of offence committed by the person in custody, and the type of housing the person of custody was being detained in when the court ordered was received.

Effective Date: Immediately upon enactment
