CHAIRPERSON FELIZ: [GAVEL] Thank you.

Good morning, everyone. I'm Oswald Feliz, and I serve as Chair to the Committee on Small Business. I would like to first start off by thanking everyone for joining us today. I would also like to thank my Staff, the Committee Staff, and my Colleagues who have joined us today including Council Members

Zhuang, Selvena Brooks-Powers, Shekar Krishnan, and Erik Bottcher.

Despite the resources that are available, navigating New York City's complex regulatory environment remains a challenge for our city's small businesses. Each business has unique circumstances,

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but it is in the city's collective interest to ensure that small businesses can effectively understand and comply with applicable regulations. My bill will do just that. Introduction 1132-A would require that the Department of Small Business Services coordinate with other agencies to develop targeted outreach programs in each borough. It would require that SBS develop these programs with the intent of assisting similarly situated small businesses within each borough, and SBS would be responsible for doing this outreach on an annual basis. In addition to borough-by-borough outreach, this bill would also require SBS to report annually on the type of education services offered, the total number of services offered, and the disaggregated by borough as well as the primary business sector these services are designed to assist. My hope is that this legislation leads to meaningful and equitable assistance to small businesses across all five boroughs and that its reporting provisions establish a strong foundation for continued improvement in how the City serves its small businesses.
