PROPOSED INTRO. NO: 1326

COMMITTEE: Public Safety

TITLE: A Local Law to amend the administrative code of the city of New York, in relation to repealing the padlock law.

SPONSORS: Council Members Levin, Torres, Williams, and The Speaker (Council Member Mark-Viverito)

SUMMARY OF LEGISLATION: Proposed Intro. 1326 would repeal the Padlock Law, which allows the Police Department to shutter a home or business without judicial review. These laws are contained in Sections 10-155 and 10-156 of the Administrative Code of the City of New York, which would be repealed.

EFFECTIVE DATE: This local law would take immediately.
