Transmitted here with are the bills signed by the Mayor. The bills are as follows:

Int. 436-A – Local Law 5

A Local Law to amend the administrative code of the city of New York, in relation to authorizing a cure period for certain item pricing violations.

Int. 570-A – Local Law 6

A Local Law to amend the administrative code of the city of New York, in relation to eliminating the prearrangement and passenger manifest requirements for commuter vans, repealing the requirement that commuter vans renew their license every six years, and repealing subdivision k of section 19-504.2.

Int. 860-A – Local Law 7

A Local Law to amend the administrative code of the city of New York, in relation to requiring a study of safety related issues in the commuter van industry and suspending new commuter van licenses pending the completion of such study.

Int. 861-A – Local Law 8

A Local Law to amend the administrative code of the city of New York, in relation to increasing certain penalties applicable to operators of commuter vans

Int. 865-B – Local Law 9

A Local Law to amend the New York city charter, in relation to reporting certain data regarding institutions in the Cultural Institutions Group.

Int. 1024-A – Local Law 10

A Local Law to amend the administrative code of the city of New York, in relation to the dissemination of senior citizen rent increase exemption information.

Int. 1052-A – Local Law 11

A Local Law to amend the administrative code of the city of New York, in relation to agency disposal of electronics.

Int. 1164-A – Local Law 12

A Local Law to amend the administrative code of the city of New York, in relation to information regarding unlawful evictions.

Int. 1166-A – Local Law 13

A Local Law in relation to reporting on violations issued to three-quarter housing.

Int. 1167-A – Local Law 14

A Local Law to amend the administrative code of the city of New York, in relation to posting of a vacate order, re-occupancy of vacated dwellings, and the provision of relocation services.

Int. 1168-A – Local Law 15

A Local Law to amend the administrative code of the city of New York, in relation to improperly conditioning residential occupancy on medical treatment.

Int. 1171-A – Local Law 16

A Local Law to amend the administrative code of the city of New York, in relation to verification of occupancy for relocation services.

Int. 1276-B – Local Law 17

A Local Law to amend the New York city charter, in relation to requiring the art commission to conduct an annual report.

Int. 1281-A – Local Law 18

A Local Law to amend the administrative code of the city of New York, in relation to the review and evaluation of economic development tax expenditures, and to repeal chapter 29 of title 11 of such code, relating to the establishment of the tax study commission.

Int. 1290-A – Local Law 19

A Local Law to amend the New York city charter, in relation to the percent for art advisory panel.

Int. 1294-A – Local Law 20

A Local Law to amend the administrative code of the city of New York, in relation to requiring the fire department to report on the use and type of smoke detectors and smoke alarms in fire-related deaths.

Int. 1295-A – Local Law 21

A Local Law to amend the New York city charter, in relation to requiring the department of cultural affairs to publish information on percent for art projects

Int. 1296-A – Local Law 22

A Local Law to amend the New York city charter, in relation to the percent for art program.

Int. 1297-A – Local Law 23

A Local Law to amend the New York city charter, in relation to outreach and education regarding public art opportunities.


Int. 1309 – Local Law 24

A Local Law to amend local law number 19 for the year 2014, amending the administrative code of the city of New York relating to increasing the maximum income level qualifying for exemption for rent increases granted to certain senior citizens, and to amend local law number 39 for the year 2014, amending the administrative code of the city of New York relating to increasing the maximum income level qualifying for exemption for rent increases granted to certain persons with disabilities, in relation to extending certain provisions thereof.

Int. 1371 – Local Law 25

A Local Law to amend the administrative code of the city of New York, in relation to authorizing an increase in the amount to be expended annually in the DUMBO business improvement district and an extension of the DUMBO business improvement district.
