SERGEANT-AT-ARMS: Good morning, and welcome to the New York City Council vote of the Committee on Civil Service and Labor.

At this time, can everybody please silence your cell phones.

Chair, we are ready to begin.

CHAIRPERSON DE LA ROSA: [GAVEL] Good morning, welcome to today's vote for the Civil Service and Labor Committee. I am Council Member Carmen De La Rosa, Chair of the Committee.

Municipal employment has long been a source of economic security for women and people of color. City jobs are coveted because they are more likely to be unionized, well-paid, and provide benefits and protections for workers. Yet in this year's Paid Disparity Report, published by the Council's Data Team, the Council determined that occupational segregation and paid disparities were still apparent in our municipal workforce, driven primarily by the concentration of women and employees of color in low-paying titles. Furthermore, this report highlighted that headcount reductions during

2 and since the COVID-19 pandemic disproportionately
3 affected women and employees of color. In response,

4 this package of legislation was drafted, seeking to

5 improve access to promotional titles with higher pay

and to identify equity-based issues within the

7 | workforce to help improve retention. That's why I'm

8 proud to support this legislative package that will

9 foster a supportive work environment and equip

10 employees with the guidance to achieve their career

11 goals.

First, Intro. 743-A, sponsored by myself, mandates that DCAS offer comprehensive career counseling to our municipal employees. This is a significant step towards ensuring that every individual in our City's workforce has access to the professional development and promotional opportunities that they deserve.

Intro. 767-A, sponsored by Council Member Hudson, aims to introduce workforce culture surveys administered by DCAS. These surveys are crucial for gaining insight into the experiences of City employees. This feedback is essential for fostering a culture of continuous improvement and ensuring that our workforce feels valued and heard.

Intro. 809-A, sponsored by myself,

requires DCAS to provide detailed reports regarding

the Department's determination of promotional exam

applicant eligibility. This reaffirms our commitment

to the meritocracy and equal opportunities for all

7 municipal employees.

Lastly, Reso 306-B, sponsored by myself, urges DCAS to grant additional promotional points on promotional exams to those who have completed the agency's executive development and management and supervision trainings or who have earned a degree or certificate. By recognizing and rewarding educational and professional development achievement, we are incentivizing our employees to continuously improve their skills and knowledge, which will in turn benefit the entire city.

Together, these measures represent a robust commitment to our municipal workforce. They underscore our dedication to creating a supportive and fair work environment that recognizes and rewards hard work, dedication, and continuous learning.
