9	morning. I'm Council Member Mercedes Narcisse, Chair							
10	of the Committee on Hospitals. Welcome to today's							
11	vote, where we will be voting on Proposed Resolution							
12	339-B, sponsored by Council Member Carlina Rivera.							
13	This resolution is in support of State							
14	Bill S.1226/A.6004, also known as the Local Input in							
15	Community Health Care Act or L I C H, LICH ACT.							
16	I want to give my full-hearted support to							
17	this resolution. Hospitals, as providers of a public							
18	service, cannot be allowed to decide to unilaterally							
19	close locations. Transparency and community							
20	engagement are crucial to ensuring that the community							
21	members' health needs are considered and that the							
22	most vulnerable are not left behind by a wealthy							
23	hospital system's bottom line.							
24	At our hearing in October of last year							
25	regarding hospital closures, we heard extensive,

1 COMMITTEE ON HOSPITALS 4 compelling testimony about the impacts of hospital 2 3 closures on neighborhood patient populations and the 4 unfortunate lack of community engagement in the hospital closure process. 5 With the recent closure of Mount Sinai 6 7 Beth Israel, this Council and our community members have become more acutely aware of the procedural 8 9 issues that limit community engagement, which continues to expand existing healthcare deserts and 10 11 exacerbate the negative outcomes that result from poor social determinants of health. 12 13 I can tell you that, as a nurse for over 14 three decades, it is hard in our community. So, 15 hospitals must work in tandem with their communities 16 to ensure that existing health inequities are 17 addressed and do not continue to grow. My Committee 18 and this Council are committed to this fight. 19 Before I (INAUDIBLE) myself, I would like 20 to make sure that all of my colleagues are here, all together, to fight this. And we have been talking 21 about it, and it's about time that it happens. And I 2.2 23 have to say, thank you, to my colleague, Council Member Rivera. 23	of us have seen over the last 20 or so years be							
24	eliminated, specifically in low-income communities							
25	and communities of color.

2	In my district, where you saw Beth							
3	IsraelMount Sinai Beth Israel closed, this has							
4	already had an impact on Bellevue Hospital in the							
5	area. We want to ensure that no one else's district							
6	is next. This bill would do that.							
7	I would also like to thank Assembly							
8	Member Jo Anne Simon and State Senator Gustavo Rivera							
9	for putting this legislation forward. It has passed							
10	the Legislature, and we are hoping that Governor							
11	Hochul will sign it right away. Thank you so much.
