CHAIRPERSON LOUIS: [GAVEL] Good morning, everyone. My name is Farrah Louis, and I'm the chair of the Committee on Women and Gender Equity. Today, the Committee will vote on two pieces of legislation. Intro. 1285-A, sponsored by Council Member Gutiérrez, amending the Administrative Code of the City of New York in relation to a citywide doula program. And Intro. 1393, sponsored by Deputy Speaker Ayala, amending the Administrative Code of the City of New York in relation to an education campaign on healthy living and managing chronic diseases during and after pregnancy.

First, I would like to acknowledge my Colleagues who are present, Council Member Cabán, 1 COMMITTEE ON WOMEN AND GENDER EQUITY

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2 Riley, and Gutiérrez. Thank you all for being here on this day.

applaud Council Member Gutiérrez for her earnest resolve in stewarding this bill. The citywide doula initiative has achieved major health milestones since its launch in 2022 and made important strides towards better health outcomes for Black and Hispanic birthing people across the city. The initiative is working to increase access to trained doulas, providing continuous support during and after childbirth for families in under-resourced neighborhoods. This legislation establishes the program by law and takes a critical step towards achieving birth equity for all New Yorkers.

Now I would like to invite the bill sponsor of the legislation, Council Member Gutiérrez, to provide remarks.

COUNCIL MEMBER GUTIÉRREZ: Thank you,

Chair. It's deeply meaningful for me to be voting

today and to pass the Citywide Doula Program Act to

make comprehensive and necessary initiative permanent

just two years after I was honored to pass the bill

that codified the pilot program. For years, doulas

1 COMMITTEE ON WOMEN AND GENDER EQUITY 2 across the city have stepped up, given their time, their wisdom, and their care many times for free. 3 4 They've taught me, they've pushed me, and they've helped me see how this system could be better. This 5 bill is for them and it belongs to them. When we 6 7 first launched the pilot in 2022, we said, let's see 8 what happens when we give people the support they deserve and advocates that are there to promote the needs of a pregnant person. Outcomes improved. The 10 11 Comptroller's audit of the DOHMH report shared that there were lower rates of C-sections, lower rates of 12 13 low birth weight and preterm births than the citywide average. And there were zero reported pregnancy 14 15 associated deaths among program clients for over two 16 years. That's an amazing, amazing stat. And that is 17 transformation and proof that investing dollars in 18 women's health improves our entire public health system. So today with Intro. 1285, we're saying this 19 20 work is not a pilot. It is not a program dependent on 21 one mayor or one budget year. It is a right. Every 2.2 birthing person, especially Black, Brown, immigrant 2.3 and low-income mothers deserve a trained advocate in the room. And thanks to the doulas who never stopped 24

showing up, who give me a hard time all the time, who

3	We are here today and we did this together and we'll
4	keep building a system where safe births are not a
5	privilege, but a promise. Thank you.
