**PROPOSED INTRO. NO: 226-A**

**COMMITTEE: Health**

**TITLE:** A Local Law to amend the administrative code of the city of New York, in relation to the definitions of terms that relate to the provision of information on child care services and to reporting on child care programs and to repeal certain provisions of the administrative code in relation thereto.

**SPONSORS:** Council Members Palma, Arroyo, Chin, Ferreras, Koppell, Mendez and Van Bramer.

**SUMMARY OF LEGISLATION:** This legislation would repeal section 17-920 of the Administrative Code. It would renumber Chapter 10 of Title 17 and sections 17-914, 17-915, 17-916, 17-917, 17-918, 17-919 and would make changes in terminology in those sections. The legislation would also add a new section 17-1307 that would reenact an expired requirement that the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene provide the Speaker of the City Council with a report on child care.

**EFFECTIVE DATE:** This local law would take effect ninety days after its enactments into law, provided that section 17-1307 of the administrative code of the city of New York, as added by section three of the local law, would expire and be deemed repealed four years after it becomes a law.
