- Int 0465-2022** A Local Law to amend the administrative code of the city of New York, in relation to a report on the provision of medical services related to reproductive health care  
*Proposed Int. No. 465-A*
- Int 0466-2022** A Local Law to amend the administrative code of the city of New York, in relation to prohibiting the use of city resources to enforce abortion restrictions  
*Proposed Int. No. 466-A*
- Int 0475-2022** A Local Law to amend the administrative code of the city of New York, in relation to a cause of action related to interference with reproductive or endocrine medical care  
*Proposed Int. No. 475-A*
- Int 0507-2022** A Local Law to amend the administrative code of the city of New York, in relation to requiring the department of health and mental hygiene to make medication abortion available at no cost to a patient at its health clinics  
*Proposed Int. No. 507-A*
- Res 0195-2022** Resolution calling upon the New York State Legislature to pass, and the Governor to sign, The Reproductive Freedom and Equity Program (S.9078/A.10148A), which would establish a grant program to provide funding to New York abortion providers and non-profit organizations to increase access to abortion care

- Res 0196-2022** Resolution calling upon the New York State Legislature to pass, and the Governor to sign, S.9137/A.10356, which would allow out-of-state physicians to provide reproductive health services in this state while awaiting full licensure.

- Res 0197-2022** Resolution declaring New York City a safe city for all those in need of abortion-related care
- Res 0200-2022** Resolution declaring January 22, 2023 as Roe v. Wade Day in the City of New York to commemorate the 50th anniversary of the landmark United States Supreme Court decision.

- Res 0245-2022** Resolution calling on the United States Senate to pass and the President to sign the Women’s Health Protection Act
