14	Good morning, I am Council Member Carmen De La
15	Rosa, Chair of the Committee on Civil Service and
16	Labor. Today, the Committee will be voting on the
17	following legislative items that seek to reduce
18	barriers to employment and advance equity in New York
19	City's workforce:
20	Proposed Introduction Number 671-A, sponsored by
21	myself, would authorize the Department of Citywide
22	Administrative Services (DCAS) to waive the civil
23	service examination fee for individuals who are
24	enrolled at any public, private, or charter high
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COMMITTEE ON CIVIL SERVICE AND LABOR
 school in New York City or who are first time
 applicants.

Proposed Resolution 333-A, sponsored by Public
Advocate Jumaane Williams, calling on the New York
State Legislature to pass, and the New York State
Governor to sign, S. 28A, and its partner, A.1006,
which would eliminate the subminimum wage for
employees based on their disability or age.

10 The pieces of legislation being voted on today 11 seek to address some of the financial hardships faced 12 by current and prospective workers in New York City.

Proposed Introduction 671-A, is a meaningful step towards opening the door to civil service for young, talented New Yorkers.

Exam fees which range from \$40 to over \$100 are a significant barrier for students and new applicants especially for those from low income households. No one should be denied a chance to serve the City simply because they can't afford a fee.

I'm proud to sponsor this legislation which builds on DCAS' efforts to modernize recruitment and bring more people into public service.

We also will be voting on proposed Intro 333-A,which supports vital legislation at the state level

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1COMMITTEE ON CIVIL SERVICE AND LABOR52to end the use of subminimum wage for workers with3disabilities or older adults.

In New York City, where roughly 11 percent of people experience some form of disability, it is imperative that we take every step to ensure that workers with a disability are treated with dignity, fairness and respect.

9 We are grateful to Senator James Skoufis and
10 Assemblymember Phil Steck for their leadership this
11 issue, and we commend public advocate Jumaane
12 Williams for bringing this resolution forward.
