Today's date is May 28, 2025, 4 being recorded by Danny Huang of the Council 5 Chambers. 6 SERGEANT-AT-ARMS: Good morning, welcome 7 to the New York City Committee on Contracts. 8 Please place your phone on vibrate or 9 silent mode. 10 Do not approach the dais during the 11 hearing. 12 Chair, we are ready to begin. 13 CHAIRPERSON WON: [GAVEL] Good morning, 14 and welcome to this Committee vote of the New York 15 City Council's Committee on Contracts. Today is 16 Wednesday, May 28, 2025. My name is Julie Won. I have 17 the privilege of Chairing this Committee. 18 Today, we're voting on Proposed 19 Introduction 905-A, which I sponsored to establish a 20 six-month pilot program for food quality feedback 21 surveys from food service contractors. This bill represents our commitment to improving accountability 22 23 and transparency in the City's food service 24 contracts, particularly in light of ongoing concerns 25 about food quality in shelters and other facilities.

2	This legislation was prompted by ongoing reports of
3	food quality issues across the city, but particularly
4	in shelters serving vulnerable populations. We've
5	heard testimony about spoiled food, meals that lack
6	cultural or religious appropriateness, and instances
7	where shelter residents have become ill after eating
8	shelter meals. When we heard from Intro. 905 on
9	February, we received testimony from the
10	Administration and advocates that highlighted both
11	the need for better quality food quality oversight as
12	well as practical challenges of implementation.
13	Through extensive negotiations with the Mayor's
14	Office, we've crafted a thoughtful, measured approach
15	that balances accountability with operational
16	feasibility. The original version of this bill would
17	have required quarterly feedback surveys for all food
18	service contracts over 100,000 dollars. This amended
19	version before the Committee today establishes a
20	targeted six-month pilot program for contracts valued
21	at 1 million dollars or more. This pilot program will
22	begin in January 2026 and will collect consumer
23	feedback on food quality, taste, and cultural
24	relevance.

2	This approach serves several important
3	purposes. First, it creates a structured mechanism
4	for collecting feedback from the people who actually
5	consume the food provided through City contracts.
6	Second, it requires transparency through public
7	reporting by participating agencies. Third, it
8	establishes a framework for the Office of Food Policy
9	to evaluate the effectiveness of collecting this type
10	of feedback and requires it to make recommendations
11	for future improvements to the survey. This pilot
12	program represents a meaningful first step towards
13	greater accountability in food service contracting.
14	The data and insights gathered during six-month
15	period will inform our decisions about how to best
16	ensure quality food services for New Yorkers in the
17	future.

Before we vote, I'd like to thank the Administration for working with us to find common ground as well as Contracts Committee Staff, Senior Counsel Alex Paulenoff; Policy Analyst Alex Yablon; and Financial Analyst Owen Kotowski for their hard work in negotiating this bill and seeing it vote through.
