CHAIRPERSON BRANNAN: Thank you, Sergeant.

[GAVEL] Okay. Good afternoon, and welcome to today's

Finance Committee meeting, where we will be adopting
the FY26 budget. I'm Councilman Justin Brannan, I

chair the Committee on Finance. I want to acknowledge
all of my Colleagues who are present, Council Members

Farías, Brewer, Louis, Ossé, Hanks, Ayala, Carr,

Powers, Moya on Zoom, Williams, Won, Brooks-Powers,

Salaam, Stevens, Sanchez, Restler, and Hudson.

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Today, the Finance Committee will take the necessary actions for the City Council to adopt a 115.9-billion-dollar budget for FY26.

To begin, I want to thank Speaker Adrienne Adams for her fearless leadership throughout her tenure as Speaker of this Council for the past four years, and throughout this entire budget process, which began literally the day after we passed the FY25 budget last summer. The Speaker's commitment to a budget that meets the needs of working people of this city and insisting that we have the resources necessary to invest in our neighbors set the tone for all of us, with a record number of baseline funding and wins for the Council. I'd also like to thank the Speaker for maintaining standards of transparency and inclusivity for all members throughout the budget. We may take it for granted now, but I can tell you that's not how it always was. I want to thank the tireless work of the Council's mighty Finance Division. Month after month of long hours of preparing for hearings, fielding questions from Members, and delivering regular briefings, presentations, and reports went into crafting this budget, and we deeply appreciate the

17	the past six months. And my Special Advisor, John
18	Yedin, for dealing with my charming impatience.

This budget represents the Council's commitment to securing key restorations to preserve the essential services that New Yorkers rely on and that allow for both a safe and healthy city.

Together, the Council and the Administration once again were able to deliver an on-time budget that not only reflects our shared priorities, but also makes

deeper investments into areas where previous budget 2 cuts are now restored. We fought with passion and 3 4 precision for a budget that delivers for the hardworking New Yorkers who make this city the capital of the world, not only by restoring the 6 7 attempted cuts, but by baselining funding to give 8 services stability and reliability in our future. As just an example of what this body accomplished, in the 115.9-billion-dollar budget, the Council secured 10 11 1.7 billion dollars for our priorities, including 12 seven-day library service to 10 new neighborhood 13 libraries, a 50-million-dollar increase in 14 immigration legal services, crucial investments in 15 mental health supports, public safety programs, and robust childcare and early childhood education 16 17 funding, with a first-of-its-kind new initiative to 18 provide free childcare for children zero to two. This 19 pilot program will help hundreds of low-income 20 families and represents a giant leap towards making 21 New York the first American city to provide free universal childcare for new parents. This, in 2.2 2.3 addition to critical allocations to CUNY, housing, mental health services, our libraries, schools, and 24 cultural institutions. We're delivering a balanced 25

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on-time budget, setting aside 8.5 billion dollars in reserves, while still investing in making our city safer, healthier, and more affordable. Our emphasis on baselining continues to reflect the Council's attention to the future, preventing future councils and administrations from negotiating over what should be bedrock funding while New Yorkers hang in the balance. Today, we're proving that you can achieve an ironclad budget that doubles down on what matters most, while still setting aside funding and reserves and investing in making our city safer, healthier, and more affordable.

We'll also be voting on three legislative items today, two Pre-Considered Resolutions, sponsored by me, relating to the property tax exemptions located in Council Member Shaun Abreu's District, and a Resolution to approve the expenditure of payments in lieu of taxes to fund the development of infrastructure over the Western Rail Yards in support of the development of housing.

Now let's turn to adopting this budget.

Before we get to the vote, I'd like to discuss the specific items that we'll vote on today. All members received a budget packet by the Committee Counsel

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that contains all the budget-related legislation that
must be voted on by the Committee, and later today by
the full Council at the stated meeting. I'm just
going to list the items that are on our agenda today
that require a vote.

Number one, resolution approving the FY26 expense budget.

Number two, a resolution approving the  $\mbox{FY26}$  contract budget.

Number three, resolutions approving the FY26 capital budget, Reso. A and Reso. B.

Number four, a resolution approving an expense budget modification, which closes out FY26.

Number five, a resolution approving a revenue budget modification, closes out FY26.

Number six, a resolution approving the proposed FY26 community development program, reallocation of 51st year funds, and proposed 52nd year program.

Number seven, three property tax resolutions, current base proportion, adjusted base proportion, and the resolution fixing the tax rates are all interlocking resolutions that together are necessary for adopting the FY26 property tax rates.

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Number eight, a resolution approving the expenditure of payment in lieu of taxes or a pilot to fund the development of infrastructure over the Western Rail Yards and Hudson Yards to support development of housing.

Number nine, a transparency resolution.

The other documents in the packet which do not require a separate vote are Schedule C, a list of the terms and conditions adopted for FY26. As a reminder, Schedule C is a schedule of the expense and contract budgets and the appropriations for the organizations listed in Schedule C are funded by the expense and contract budgets. Council Members will have to sign a disclosure form indicating whether or not a conflict exists with any of the groups listed in Schedule C or Reso. A, which details the designations of capital discretionary funds. A separate disclosure form must be completed for the transparency resolution. If any Council Member has a potential conflict of interest with any of the organizations included, they've got the opportunity to disclose the conflict at the time of their vote. If you've not yet signed those disclosure forms, we've got Staff from the General Counsel with us now

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2	to guide you through the process. As a further
3	reminder, please disclose any conflicts you may have
1	with proposed subcontractors that are used by any of
5	the organizations sponsored. These disclosures must
5	be made before the subcontractor can be approved. And
7	those are all of our items today.

With that, I will turn it over to Billy Martin, the Committee Clerk, to call the roll.

COMMITTEE CLERK WILLIAM MARTIN: Good afternoon. William Martin, Committee Clerk. Roll call vote, Committee on Finance. All items are coupled. Chair Brannan.

CHAIRPERSON BRANNAN: I vote aye.

COMMITTEE CLERK WILLIAM MARTIN: Ayala.

COUNCIL MEMBER AYALA: I am disclosing on the record of the Council proceedings that AHRC is funded in the budget that we are adopting and my partner is associated with that organization, and that Health and Hospitals and the New York City Department of Parks and Recreation are funded in the budget we are adopting and my sons are associated with those organizations as well.

I also wanted to thank the Finance Division. Thank you, guys. You guys have been

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adopting and I am associated with that organization,
and that the YMCA is funded in the budget we are
adopting and my family and I are associated with that
entity, and that the New York City Department of
Education, Edge School of the Arts and Community
Youth Care Services Incorporated are funded in the
budget we are adopting and my child is associated
with those entities.

And I'd also like to take a moment to just thank Chair Brannan for his leadership on the Finance Committee for the past four years and really ensuring that the ship continues to be straight and narrow and to the amazing Finance Staff that works tirelessly around the clock which a lot of New Yorkers do not get to witness. Thank you for the work that you've done on that to once again bring us to today to vote and adopt a budget that is reflective of the needs of this great City of New York. Thank you.

COMMITTEE CLERK WILLIAM MARTIN: Brewer.

COUNCIL MEMBER BREWER: I am disclosing on the record of the Council proceedings that the City University are funded in the budget we are adopting

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and I am associated with that entity as a professor there, and I am voting aye.

I too want to thank Chair Brannan and thank the Staff, and I think New Yorkers are still hurting but I hope that this budget gives them some solace. We still have a lot to do. Thank you.

COMMITTEE CLERK WILLIAM MARTIN: Farías.

COUNCIL MEMBER FARÍAS: I vote aye, and I just want to congratulate Chair Brannan and the entire Finance Division for their work on this budget.

COMMITTEE CLERK WILLIAM MARTIN: Hanks.

COUNCIL MEMBER HANKS: I vote age on all with the exception of the... which I vote no on the tax filing Resos and accompanying reports and congratulations and big thanks to Chair Brannan.

COMMITTEE CLERK WILLIAM MARTIN: Thank you. Hudson.

COUNCIL MEMBER HUDSON: I'm disclosing on the record of the Council proceedings that the Brooklyn Museum Botanical Garden and Brooklyn Academy of Music are funded in the budget we are adopting and I'm associated with those entities, and that the Museum of the City of New York is funded in the

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budget we are adopting and my spouse is associated
with that entity, and that Unlocal Inc. is funded ir
the budget we are adopting and my tenant is
associated with that entity. I vote aye on all.

Congratulations to Chair Brannan for yet another successful budget and thank you to the whole Finance Staff for getting us to this point. Thanks.

COUNCIL MEMBER OSSÉ: I vote aye.

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I would like to disclose on the record of the Council proceedings that the Children's Rescue Fund is funded in the budget we are adopting and my sibling is associated with this non-profit. Also, CUNY is funded in this budget we are adopting and I am still affiliated with CUNY, and also Queens Alumnae Chapter of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority Incorporated is being funded in this budget we are adopting, and I am affiliated with that entity.
