T2003-0506	Oversight - Help America Vote Act of 2002, 116 Stat. 1666: Assessing the Impact. How Will The Money for Voting Modernization Be Disbursed and Spent? How Will the Anti-Fraud Provisions Affect the Voting Process?	
Res 0443-2002	Resolution calling upon the New York State Legislature and the Governor to accommodate people with disabilities with fully accessible voting machines by requiring immediate implementation of technologically advanced voting systems to significantly improve the election process and enhance democratic participation.	
Res 0444-2002	Resolution supporting the elimination of all obstacles and barriers which prevent citizens with disabilities from exercising their constitutional right to cast a secret ballot, freely and independently, in all elections held in the City and State of New York.	
Res 0445-2002	Resolution supporting the provisions of the Help America Vote Act of 2002, United States Public Law 107-252, 116 Stat. 1666, which mandate that access to voting be provided for all people with disabilities and establish national standards for machine and polling place access, but condemning that portion of the Help America Vote Act of 2002 which requires that voters present a photo identification or documented proof of a place of residence as conditions for casting their vote in person under certain circumstances.
